



### **Grain Production**




GRAINS: cotton, peanut, rice, oats, rye, barley, beans, sunflowers, castor bean, corn, soy, sorgum, wheat and triticale.



#### Average productivity growth (1991 and 2007)




#### **Meat Production**









#### Brazilian Agribusiness Exports (by value): Main Markets




### **Agribusiness Trade Balance**
