Damona Doye

2006–2007 President

Damona Doye is an Extension Economist and Regents Professor at Oklahoma State University. An Oklahoma native, she joined the faculty at OSU in 1986 upon completing her Ph.D. at Iowa State University. In 1992, she worked in Poland as an economics advisor in the Polish/American Extension Project and has had short-term assignments in Poland and Armenia.

Damona is the author or coauthor of more than 400 publications on farm financial management, record-keeping, leasing, enterprise analysis, cost of production, integrated resource management, and management information systems. Her website and materials that teach producers how to use Quicken for farm financial records have been used nationally. She has served as principal investigator (PI) or co-PI on approximately \$2,100,000 of funded projects and participated in an additional \$1,900,000 of funded projects. Damona has supervised the state Intensive Financial Management and Planning Support program to provide Oklahoma farm families with one-on-one assistance in business financial planning since 1999. Currently, she is coleader of the Oklahoma Master Cattleman program.

Damona has held leadership positions in a variety of professional associations. She has served as the Southern Agricultural Economics Association president-elect (2005–2006), first vice president (1997–1998) and second vice president (1996–1997), chaired the selected papers process, and served on the association's Extension Awards Committee. She is chair of the North Central Farm Management Extension Committee and past chair of the Southern Extension Farm Management Committee. Damona was president of the American Agricultural Economics Association (AAEA) Extension Section in 2003–2004, served on its board of directors from 2001 to 2005, and



served on the AAEA Extension Committee from 1988 to 1992 and from 1996 to 1999.

Damona has received the Southern Agricultural Economics Association (SAEA) Distinguished Extension Program twice, once in 2002 and once in 1997. She has received a variety of other awards, including three National Awards from the National Association of County Agricultural Agents for Learning Modules in 2005, 2001, and 2000. Other recognitions include the Oklahoma Association of Agricultural Extension Agents Outstanding State Specialist Award, the Oklahoma Cattleman's Association Distinguished Service Award, an Iowa State University Outstanding Young Alumna award, and the Oklahoma District Exchange Club Member of the Year.
