

Gentlemen:

It is my pleasure to submit the 1973 Agricultural Crop Report for Amador County in accordance with Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code.

The values in this report represent the gross values of commercial agricultural production in Amador County. On this basis the total value of farm production in the County amounted to \$7,023,100 for 1973 as compared to a revised figure of \$5,116,400 for 1972. Although the gross income indicated by this report is a new record, it is not necessarily a reflection of increased grower profit. Production and marketing costs have continued to rise, limiting net incomes.

Stronger prices for all commodities plus higher yields for the fruit and nut crops contributed to the increase. The value of grape production passed the \$1,000,000 mark for the first time, an increase of 85% over 1972.

I wish to thank the many growers and other individuals who have contributed to the preparation of this report.



In accordance with Section 2279 of the Agricultural Code, I hereby submit the 1974 Agricultural Crop eport.

Amador County's total gross farm crop value for 1974 is \$5,187,800. This represents a reduction of over 26% from the all time high in 1973 of \$7,023,100. In the 1974 crop season there were considerable price differentials for many commodities, with livestock and wine grape prices showing the most dramatic change.

The values contained in this report are gross values and in no way reflect the net gain to the producer.

All three of the major fruit and nut crops in Amador County showed decreases both in price and yield for 1974. The decrease in yield was caused by spring weather conditions.

Livestock production figures showed beef cattle prices off 22%. Hog prices were also lower, but sheep and lamb prices reflected a slight increase. Overall livestock and poultry values were off almost \$1,500,000.

Most field crop prices were up considerably in 1974. Total gross values for field crops increased 18% over 1973.

I am grateful to all individuals and organizations who contributed information to this report.
