In accordance with the provisions of Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code, I hereby submit the annual crop report for Del Norte County for the year 1951.

Del Norte County, which is situated in the northwestern corner of California, comprises 641,920 acres of land and 6,400 acres of inland waters. There are 450,000 acres of forested areas, 20,000 acres of land are devoted to agricultural purposes, and the balance of the land embraces State Parks, cities and industrial sites. The total assessed valuation is \$13,962,837.00.

The largest source of farm income is derived from (a) dairy products, (b) beef cattle, and (c) Easter lillies, respectively. The present trend indicates a definite increase of beef stock and decrease of dairy stock, which is due, principally, to the increased price of beef, lower cost of production, and the very limited availability of labor.

During the past year, lily farm acreage was considerably increased, although there was a reduced number of growers. This industry, with the "boom" period past, is now becoming more stabilized, with indications of reasonable profits, comparable to any other nursery venture.

Depredation of livestock and poultry by predatory animals has been kept to a minimum, due to the efforts of a predatory animal hunter, employed by the County, in cooperation with State and Federal governments.

It will be noted that the amounts shown as farm income on the subsequent report are gross figures, no deductions having been made for cost of production.

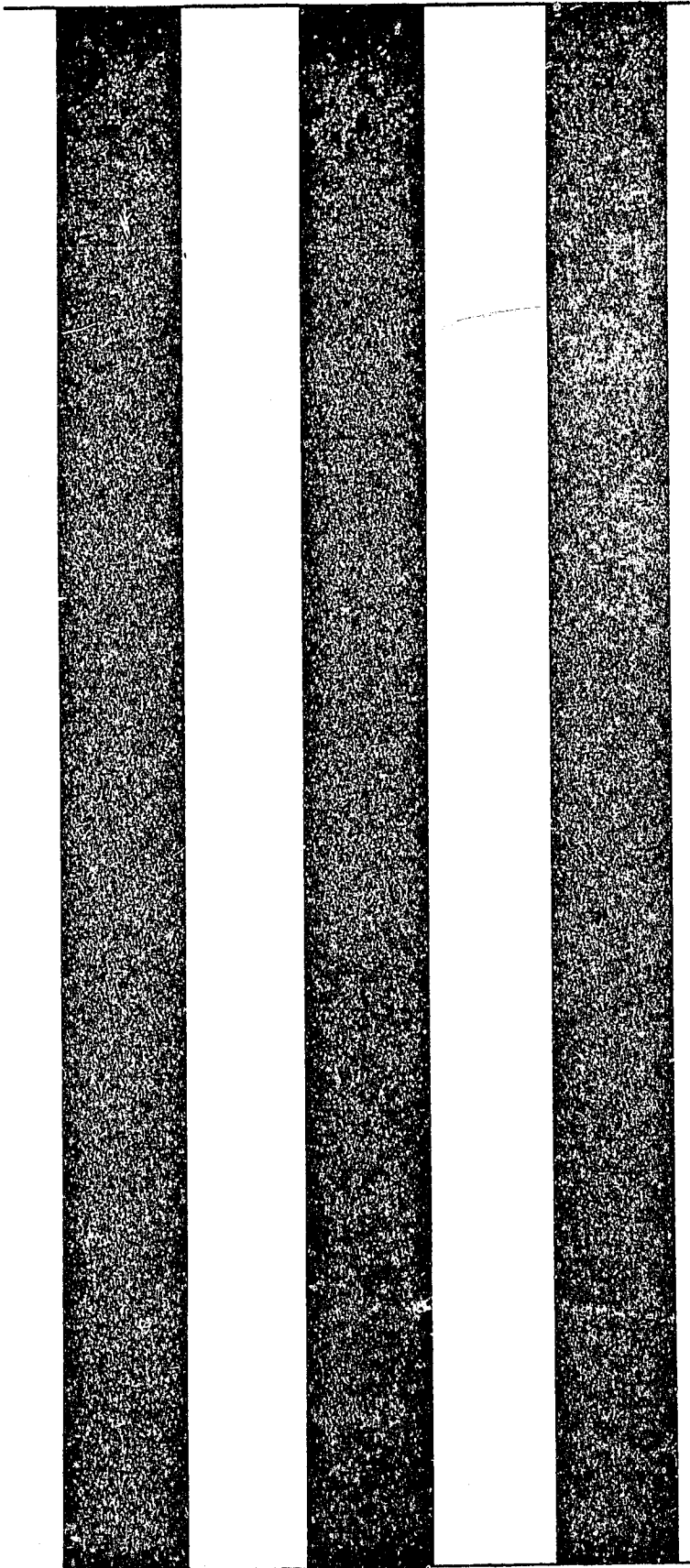

In accordance with the provisions of Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code, I hereby submit the annual crop report of Del Norte County for the year 1952.


Del Norte County is situated in the Northwestern corner of California, comprises 641,000 acres of land and 6,400 acres of inland waters. There are 450,000 acres of forests and 23,000 acres of land devoted to agriculture. 70% of the land is not taxable, being National Forests and State Parks. The total assessed valuation is \$15,600,352.00. Population estimated at 14,000.

As in the past, the largest source of farm income is derived from (a) dairy products, (b) beef production, (c) easter lily production.

The Smith River Cooperative Creamery purchased Parkside Dairy this last year, giving the co-op members an outlet for their milk other than manufacturing. Many dairymen are changing their operations to meet the ever increasing demand for market milk in this area.

It will be noted that the amounts shown as farm income on the subsequent report are gross figures, no deductions having been made for cost of production. Timber figures used are not added to the gross income, but are included in this report as an indication of balance between agriculture and lumbering. Timber price used is based on stumpage and not the finished product.

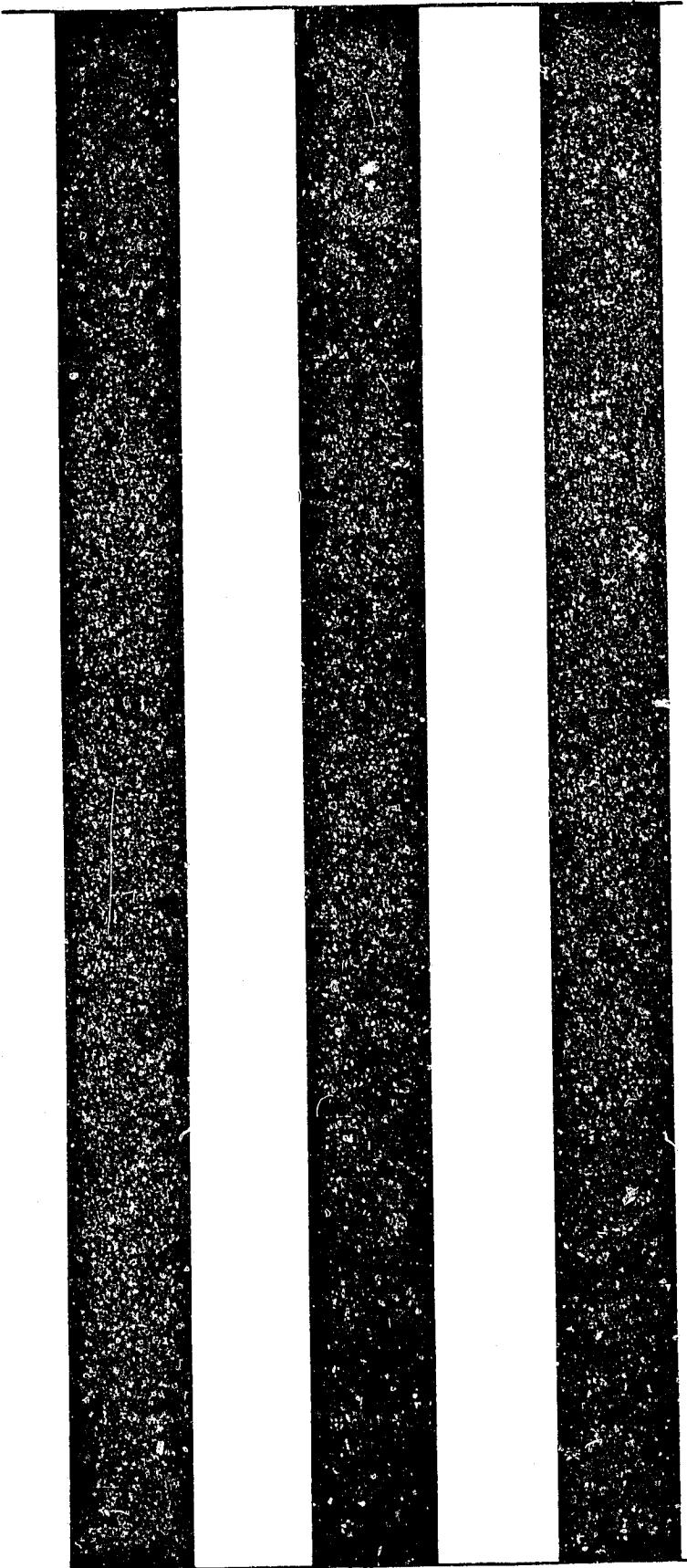

EASTER LILY BULB PRODUCTION

Principal varieties grown are Croft, Ace and Kenyon Davis. There are 121 acres devoted to lily bulb production in Del Norte County, producing 15,000 to 35,000 bulbs per acre. Twenty-seven individuals derive the bulk of their income from lilies of these twenty-seven growers. Seventeen growers cultivate less than 5 acres of bulbs; six growers, 5 acres; three growers, 10 acres and more.

Prices in 1952 were very unstable . . . Size 7 - 10¢ each; 8 - 15¢ to 20¢; 9 - 15¢ to 25¢; 10 - 25¢ and 30¢. All Aces received a 5¢ premium above the going market prices. This variety was all sold, whereas many of the other varieties were unsold. Many bulbs were sold at 5¢ lower than the above price ranges.

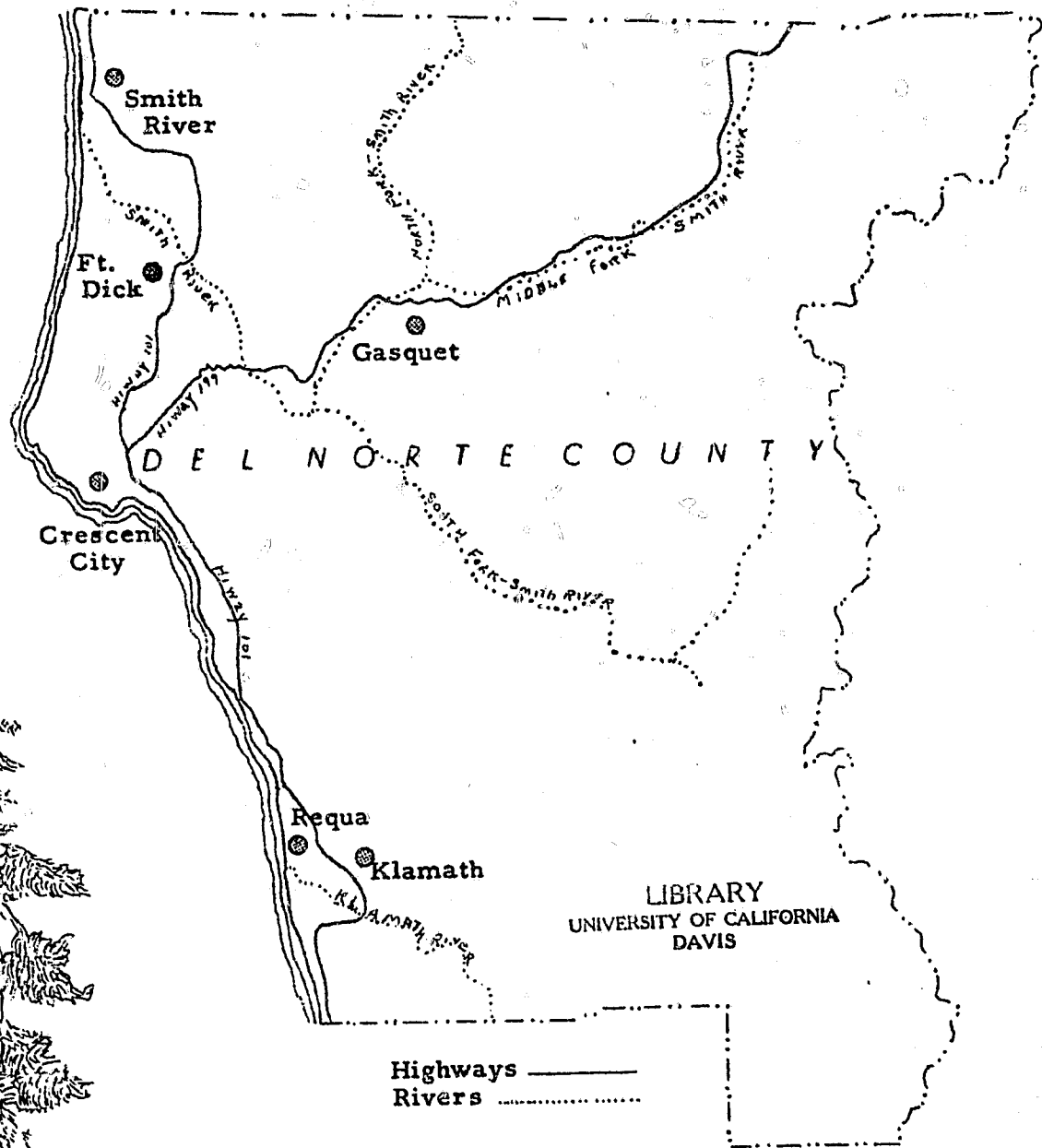

Lower market prices resulted in reduction in total livestock production values despite a gain in number of head of both cattle and calves.


Nursery product values show a substantial gain over 1963. This increase due in some instances to increased production area. Fern and decoratives gains are due mainly to several new products and better marketing methods.



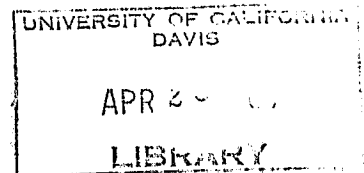
