



# Food Insecurity\*




# Participation in Federal Nutrition Programs\*

#### Poverty, Unemployment and SNAP




#### **Express SNAP**

#### Since 2006, **Express SNAP** has:

- Issued more than 2,500 LINK cards;
- Provided \$1.1 million in SNAP benefits;
- 65% recertification rate;
- Reduced application time to 20 30 minutes;
- Increased participation among targeted groups;
- Estimated 20% increase in participation rate if implemented throughout the state.
