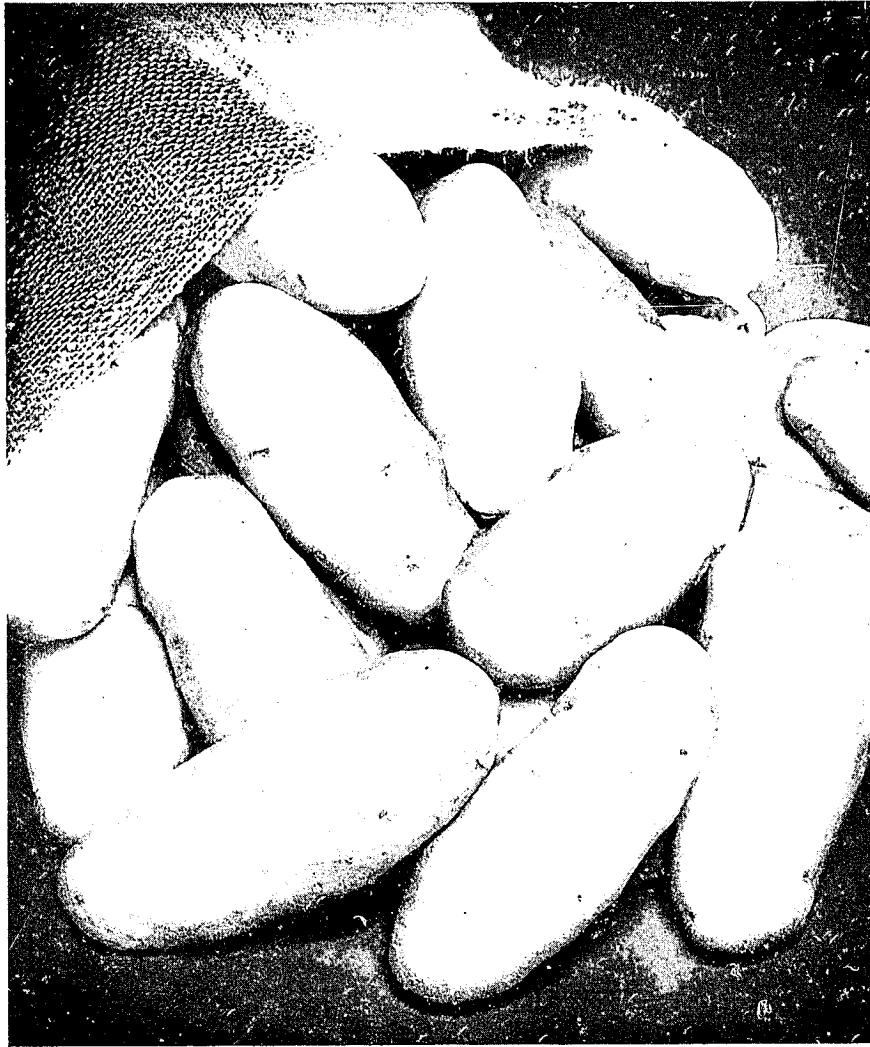

In accordance with section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code, I hereby submit the Annual Crop Report for Kern County. This report covers the acreage, production and value of all crops produced in the county, including livestock and livestock products. Acreage of permanent crops is reported in actual bearing acres only.

General conditions were favorable throughout 1955 for agricultural production, and cotton continued to lead all other crops in gross income. Allotments reduced the planted acreage from 205,341 in 1954 to 177,815 in 1955, a loss of 27,526 acres, but once again Kern County farmers have broken their own record by producing the outstanding yield of 943 pounds lint per acre.

Potatoes were next in total value. The 1955 acreage was increased by 17.7% and the total production was increased by 25.95% above the previous year. A California State Marketing Order was in effect and only potatoes of U.S. No. 2 grade or better were allowed on the commercial market. Even so, many problems had to be faced with the marketing of 12-1/2 million sacks of potatoes and the net returns to growers were not as favorable as had been anticipated.

Vineyardists had a record production of nearly 6-1/2 million lugs of table grapes. The crop failed to mature as early as usual and as a result the growers were faced with a marketing problem which brought lower prices and a decrease in gross returns compared with a year ago.


Spotted alfalfa aphid invaded our fields during the latter part of the year. Growers started control measures immediately which saved the over-all yields from being too greatly reduced.

Livestock production and prices were both decreased from a year ago and total returns indicate a gross return of 21% less than last year.

From 660,590 planted acres the return to agriculture amounted to \$206,473,112, a decrease of 8% from the 1954 totals, but still a very impressive picture and one of which we are well proud. All prices in our crop report are based on f.o.b. market values and do not represent the net amount received by growers. From this income must be deducted the costs of production and preparation for market.

Our thanks and appreciation are extended to each person who cooperated by making records and data available to us for this annual crop report.

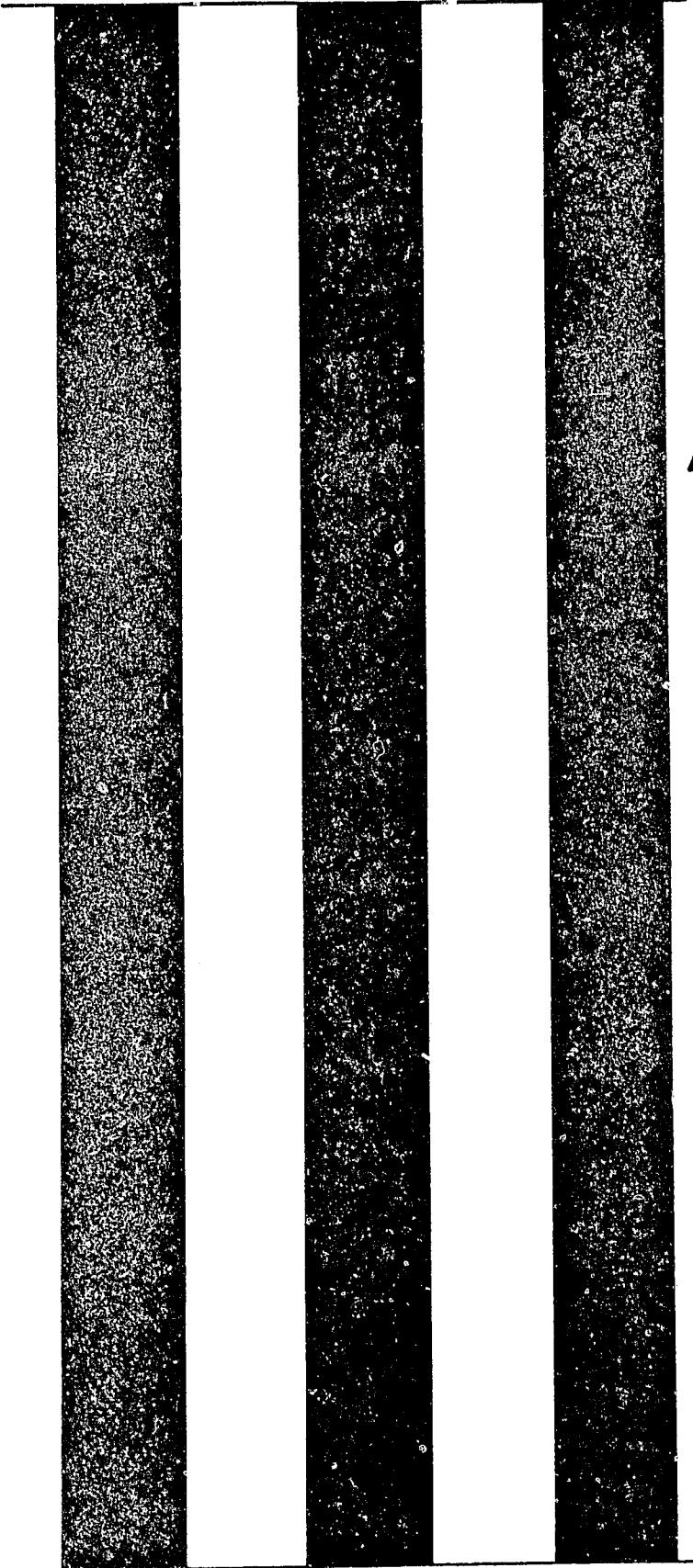

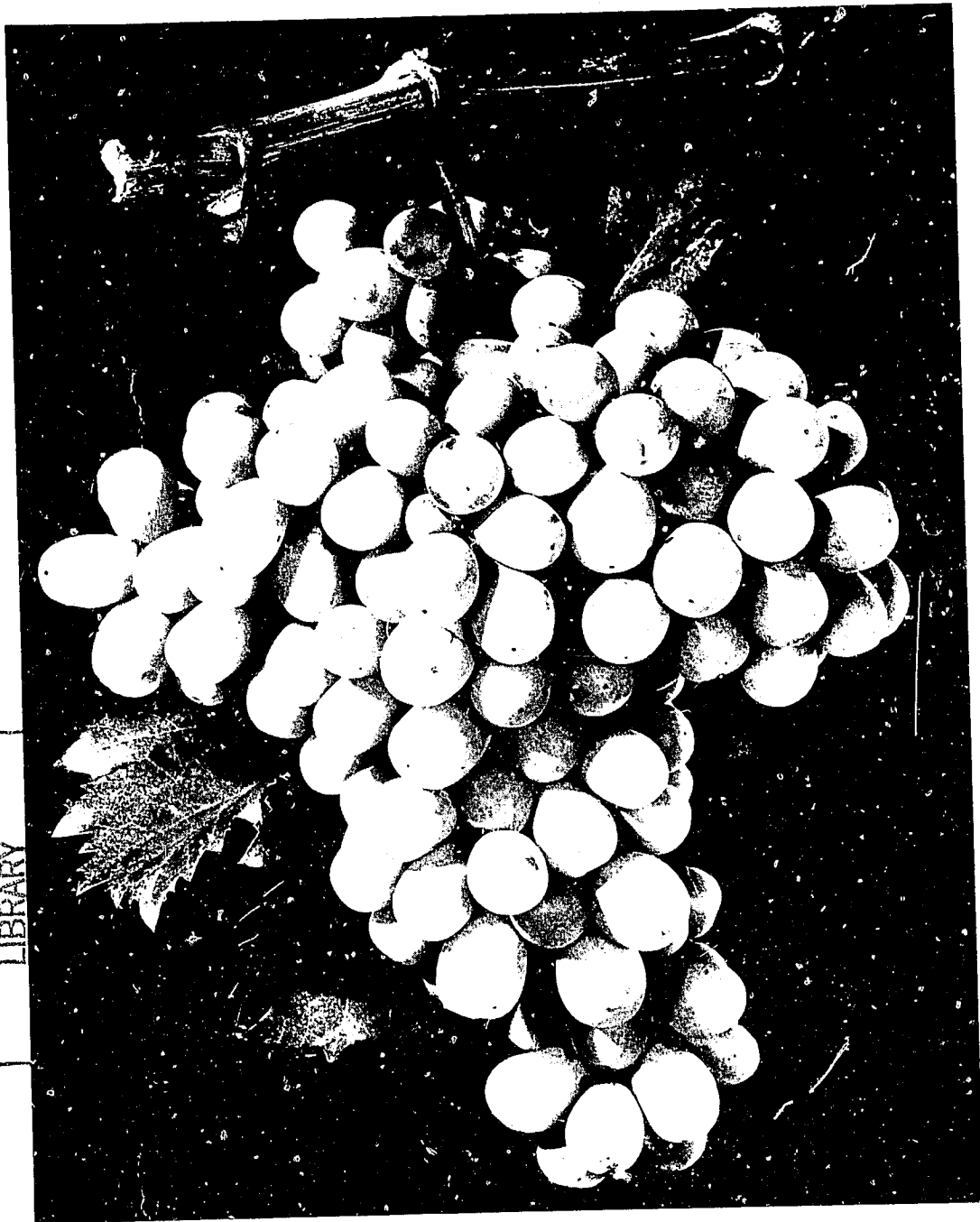

In accordance with Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code I hereby submit the Annual Crop Report for Kern County. This report covers the acreage, production and value of all crops produced in the county, including livestock and livestock products. Acreage of permanent crops is reported in actual bearing acres only.

Conditions can never be absolutely perfect for all crops throughout our long growing season, but 1956 should go down in the records as a year when Mother Nature cooperated to her fullest extent. Other than one storm early in the fall which lowered the grade of alfalfa seed remaining to be harvested, the overall conditions for agriculture were favorable. As a result our leading crop, cotton, had another record yield of 1106 pounds lint per acre. This compares to 943 pounds lint in 1955, 913 in 1954, 738 in 1953 and 698 pounds lint per acre in 1952. From an only slightly increased acreage Kern County farmers produced 21 per cent more cotton than a year ago. It is certainly a tribute to our growers and the cotton industry as a whole.

Farmers with early potatoes had a banner year and one that will long be remembered. The planted acreage was considered just about right for this district, the crop was excellent, and prices were what the growers had been looking forward to for several seasons. From an acreage only 2 per cent higher than a year ago the gross returns were increased by 52 per cent.

Grapes remained the third largest money making crop in the county. Returns were less than the previous year because of a reduction in acreage and a lighter yield per acre.


Alfalfa acreage increased 16 per cent, but gross returns were less than last year because of lower prices. Net returns to growers will be reduced to an even greater extent because of the additional expense for control measures on spotted alfalfa aphid.

Livestock production was decreased from a year ago and total returns indicate a gross return of 10 per cent less than last year.

From 665,970 planted acres the return to agriculture amounted to \$233,263,728, an increase of 13 per cent above 1955 totals. All prices in our crop report are based on f.o.b. market values and do not represent the net amount received by growers. From this income must be deducted the costs of production and preparation for market.

Our thanks and appreciation are extended to each person who cooperated by making records and data available to us for this annual crop report.

In accordance with Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code I hereby submit the Annual Crop Report for Kern County. This report covers the acreage, production and value of all crops produced in the county, including livestock and livestock products. Acreage of permanent crops is reported in actual bearing acres only.

Gross income for 1957 was only slightly lower than the previous year, despite an unusually bad potato market which brought returns for that crop down 52% compared with 1956.

Cotton farmers continued to break their own production records and this year we have another all-time high of 1207 pounds lint per acre. Total returns amounted to ninety million dollars, which accounts for 39% of the total agricultural income of the County of Kern.

Vineyardists realized a 15% increase in income over 1956 returns. Quality was excellent and growers found a receptive market for their crop. The price for wine grapes at \$50 per ton was the highest received since 1950.


Alfalfa hay acreage was slightly decreased, but gross returns were considerably higher because of an increase both in price per ton and tons per acre. This was probably accountable to a reduction in the spotted alfalfa aphid population. Many farmers did not start control measures until late in July, and in most cases it was not necessary to treat more than three times.

Total income from livestock was increased 29%. Prices were higher than a year ago and more pounds were produced.

From 689,209 planted acres the total return to agriculture amounted to \$232,304,078. All prices in our crop report are based on f.o.b. market values and do not represent the net amount received by growers. From this income must be deducted the costs of production and preparation for market.

We extend our thanks and appreciation to each person who supplied us with records and data for this annual crop report.

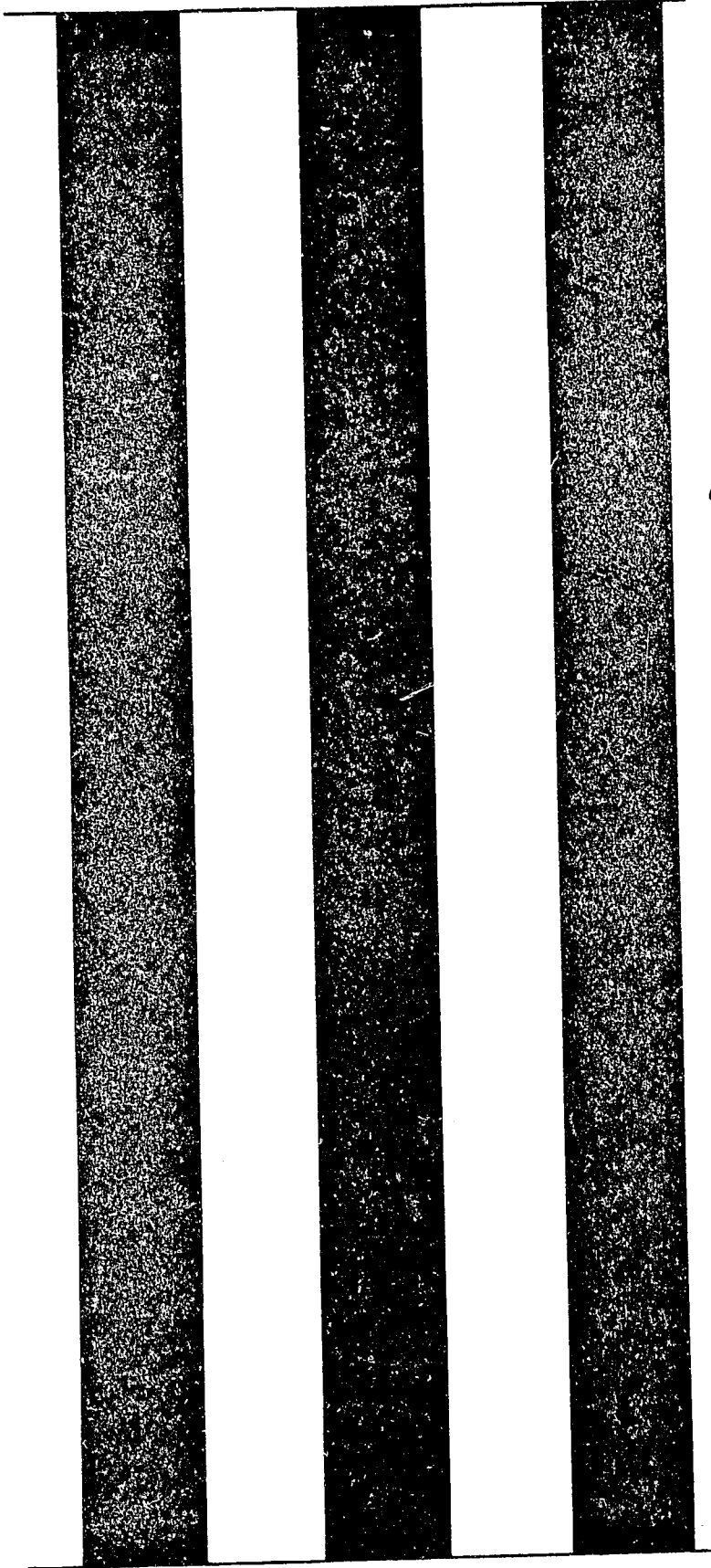

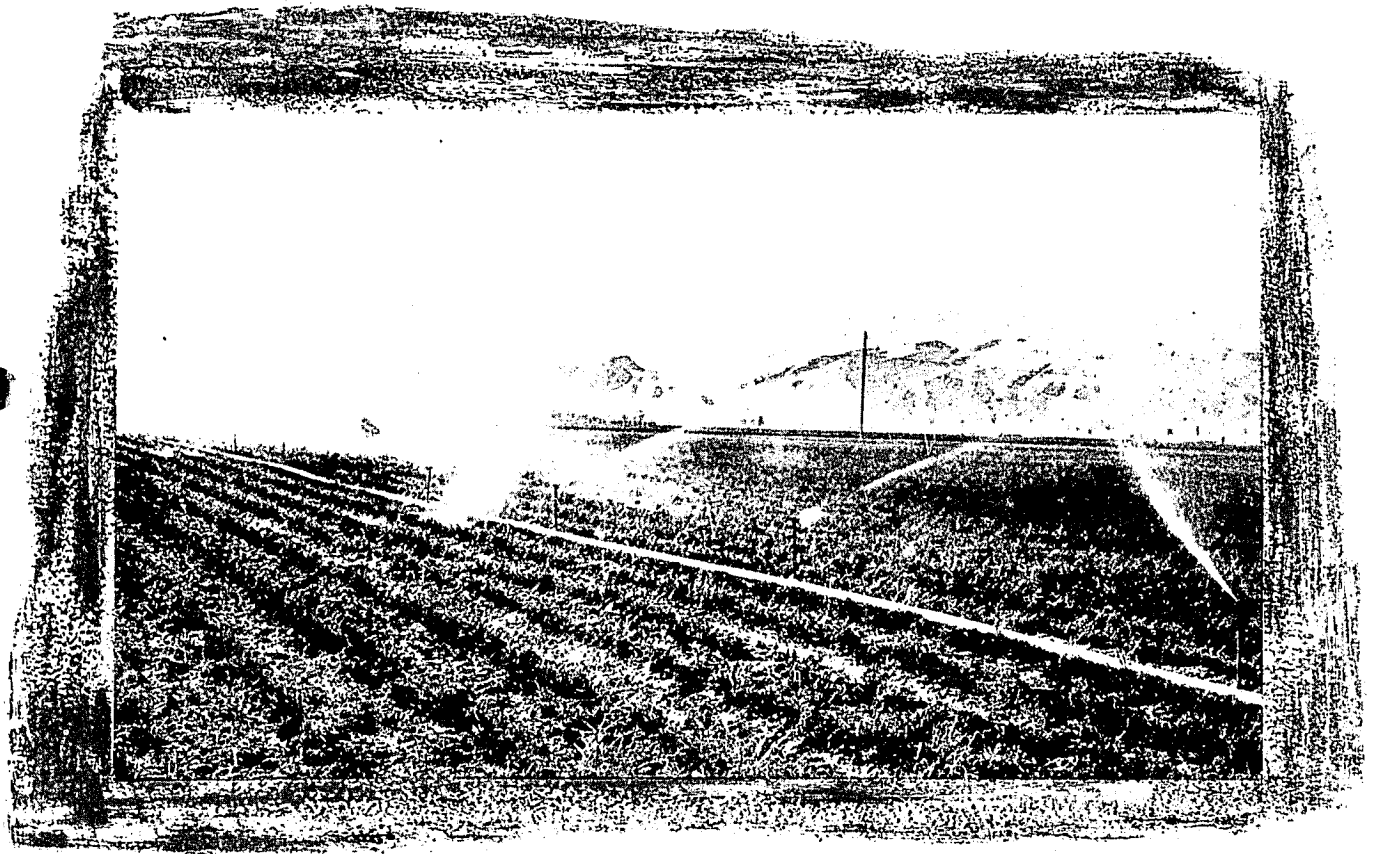

In accordance with Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code I hereby submit the Annual Crop Report for the County of Kern. This report covers the acreage, production and value of all crops produced in the county, including livestock and livestock products. Acreages of permanent crops are reported in actual bearing acres only, and other crops are reported in actual harvested acreage.

Gross income for 1958 was slightly above the previous year despite a 9% decrease in returns from cotton--the crop which represents 35% of our total agricultural income. Production was down to 1137 pounds lint per acre, and the price per pound was also less than a year ago.

It was not a profitable year for those who planted potatoes, and even though our report indicates a return of 25 million dollars this cannot be considered as the actual gross return to farmers. In many instances price adjustments to receivers lowered the original f.o.b. prices on which our report is based.

Vineyardists had another good year with an increase of 18% over 1957 returns.

Income from seed production was off 16% compared to a year ago. Alfalfa hay also brought a smaller return.


Acreage planted to melons was increased 82% and gross returns were reflected almost to the same extent. A tremendous increase was also seen in production of nursery stock. Several large nurseries have recently established growing grounds in Kern County for rose bushes, ornamentals, fruit and shade trees.

Total income from livestock was decreased slightly from last year. Actually more head of cattle were sold, but fatter cattle were brought into the feed lots and so less pounds were produced locally.

From 708,052 planted acres the total return to agriculture amounted to \$232,563,397. All prices in our crop report are based on f.o.b. market values and do not represent the net amount received by growers. From this income must be deducted the costs of production and preparation for market.

A sincere thanks is extended to everyone who cooperated with the personnel of this department and supplied us with the information which has been compiled into our annual crop report.

In accordance with Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code I hereby submit the Annual Crop Report for the County of Kern. This report covers the acreage, production and value of all crops produced in the county, including livestock and livestock products. Acreage of permanent crops is reported in actual bearing acres only, and other crops are reported in actual harvested acreage.

Our report takes on a different form this year, and we hope you will find it convenient and acceptable. It is the final development of a uniform basis for reporting agricultural statistics by all counties. Because of additions or deletions in certain categories some items cannot be strictly compared; however, the overall picture has not been greatly changed and we feel it is a more efficient method of reporting our agricultural production.

Gross income for 1959 was 15% above the previous year. This again reflects the influence of our most productive crop, cotton, which represents one-third of our total agricultural income. We had more acreage than a year ago and production increased to 1188 pounds lint per acre.

The potato crop showed a 13% increase. Both yield and price were better than a year ago; however during a portion of the 1959 season the reported f.o.b. price, which by necessity we must use in our report, was greater than the actual f.o.b. price received by producers because of speculative and circuitous routing influences.

Farmers who had alfalfa hay for sale were in an enviable position. Total returns for the year were 52% above 1958. Acreage was increased, production was increased, and the price at \$31.15 per ton was the highest received since 1952.

Income from grapes and seed crops both decreased slightly. Beef cattle production showed an 11% decrease. A greater number of head were marketed, but fewer pounds were produced locally and prices were less than a year ago.

From 705,060 planted acres and 2,701,000 acres of rangeland the total return to agriculture amounted to \$267,519,411. All prices in our crop report are based on f.o.b. market values and do not represent the net amount received by growers. From this income must be deducted the cost of production and preparation for market.

We extend our most sincere thanks to each person who cooperated with the personnel of this department and supplied us with the information which has been compiled into our annual crop report.

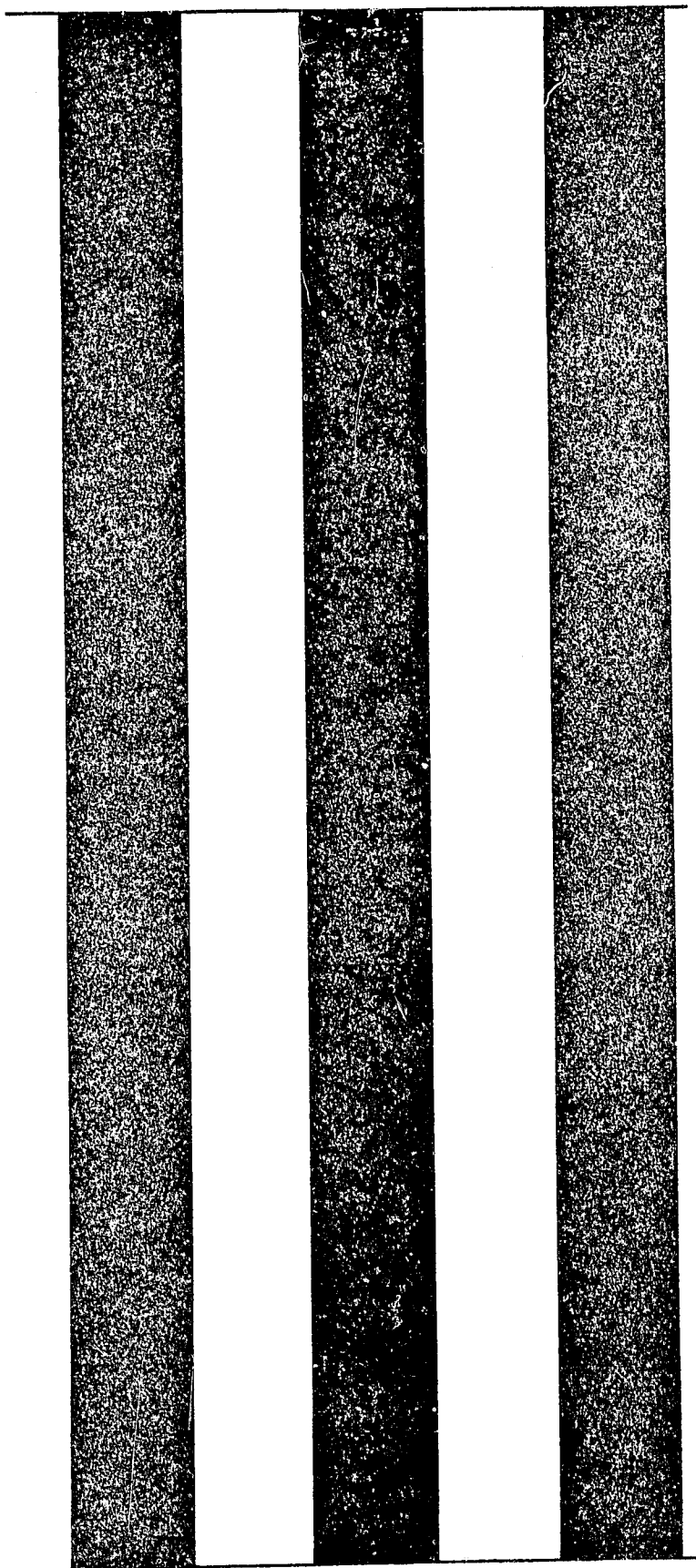

In accordance with Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code I hereby submit the Annual Crop Report for the County of Kern. This report covers the acreage, production and value of all agricultural crops produced in the county, including livestock and livestock products. Acreage of permanent crops is reported in actual bearing acres only, all other crops are reported in actual harvested acreage or rangeland.

From 687,671 planted acres and 2,700,000 acres of rangeland the total gross return to agriculture amounted to \$246,997,563, which is a 6-1/2 percent decrease from the previous year.

Despite an increase in cotton acreage total production decreased approximately 130 pounds lint per acre. Adverse weather conditions beginning with unseasonably cold days in April and May, extreme heat in June and July, and early fall rains all contributed to a lighter harvest. It is a real tribute to Kern County farmers that regardless of conditions beyond their control, plus the eternal fight against insects, they were still able to maintain a production of 1035 pounds lint per acre.

Potato growers had a good year. Prices were a little lower than the year before, but increased acreage and production brought a gross return of 8 percent over 1959.

It was not quite such a bright picture for the grape growers. Both production and price were down on table varieties. Raisin varieties produced less and brought the same return as a year ago. Processing grapes were down in value, and wine varieties had a higher yield with slightly higher prices. The total gross valuation was down 14 percent.

Alfalfa hay brought less per ton than during the previous season. Certified seed crops decreased 31 percent in acreage and 37 percent in valuation.

New acreage of peaches came into production and for the first time this commodity became one of our "million dollar" crops. Melons and plums also did well and increased in value.

Because of poor feed conditions cattlemen were reluctant to bring in replacement stock from other areas, causing a reduction in total number of head marketed. The feedlot industry continued to expand, however, and the total number of pounds produced in the county was greater than the year before. Total valuation for livestock and poultry and allied products increased by less than 3 percent from the previous year.

All prices used in our crop report are based on f.o.b. market values and do not represent the net amount received by growers. From this income must be deducted the cost of production and preparation for market.

The compilation of this report, which is so widely used, is an extremely important part of our work. To everyone who cooperated by supplying us with the necessary information we extend our sincere and wholehearted thanks and appreciation.

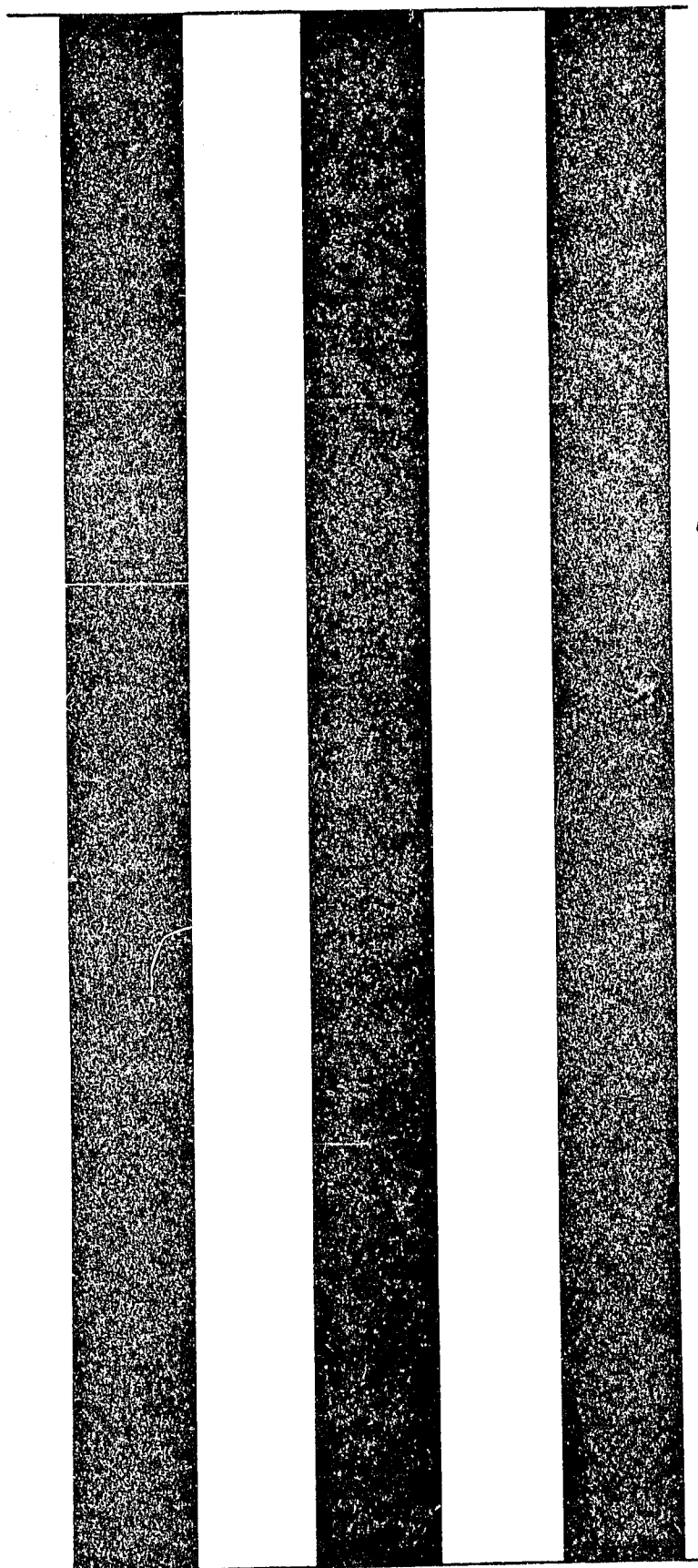

The Annual Crop Report for the County of Kern is submitted in accordance with Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code. This report covers the acreage, production and value of all agricultural crops produced in the county, including livestock and livestock products. Acreage of permanent crops is reported in actual bearing acres only, all other crops are reported in harvested acreage or rangeland. For greater uniformity with all county reports the 1961 figures have been rounded.

From 698,777 planted acres and 2,700,000 acres of rangeland the total gross return to agriculture amounted to \$235,576,740, which is a four percent decrease from the previous year.

Cotton acreage and total number of bales were both down from the prior year; however, the pounds lint per acre increased from 1027 to 1050 and as a result the total valuation of our cotton crop is down only a little more than five percent from the 1960 figures.

The potato market was depressed during most the spring season when the bulk of our crop is harvested, and the total valuation of this important commodity was decreased by 35 percent.

Despite the hot weather in June which was certainly disastrous to some growers, the overall grape production of all varieties is just a little higher, valuation is also better, and the total crop was worth 23 percent more than a year ago.

The average price per ton for alfalfa hay was the lowest it has been since 1953. A very small portion of the total production was cut from certified alfalfa seed acreage, but with the price so low seed growers for the most part did not attempt to make a cutting for hay. Total production and value of seed crops remained about the same.

Last year peaches were a one million dollar crop and this year they are a two million dollar crop. About 500 acres started to bear for the first time. Production was good, and although prices fluctuated a great deal our fresh market crop brought good returns to growers.

It is estimated 244,000 head of cattle were marketed through our local feedyards. This is considerably more than a year ago and brought the total valuation up by 22 percent.

All prices used in our crop report are based on f.o.b. market values and do not represent the net amount received by growers. From this income must be deducted the cost of production and preparation for market.

My most sincere thanks is extended to each and every person who cooperated with the department by furnishing information and statistics and as a result made this report possible.

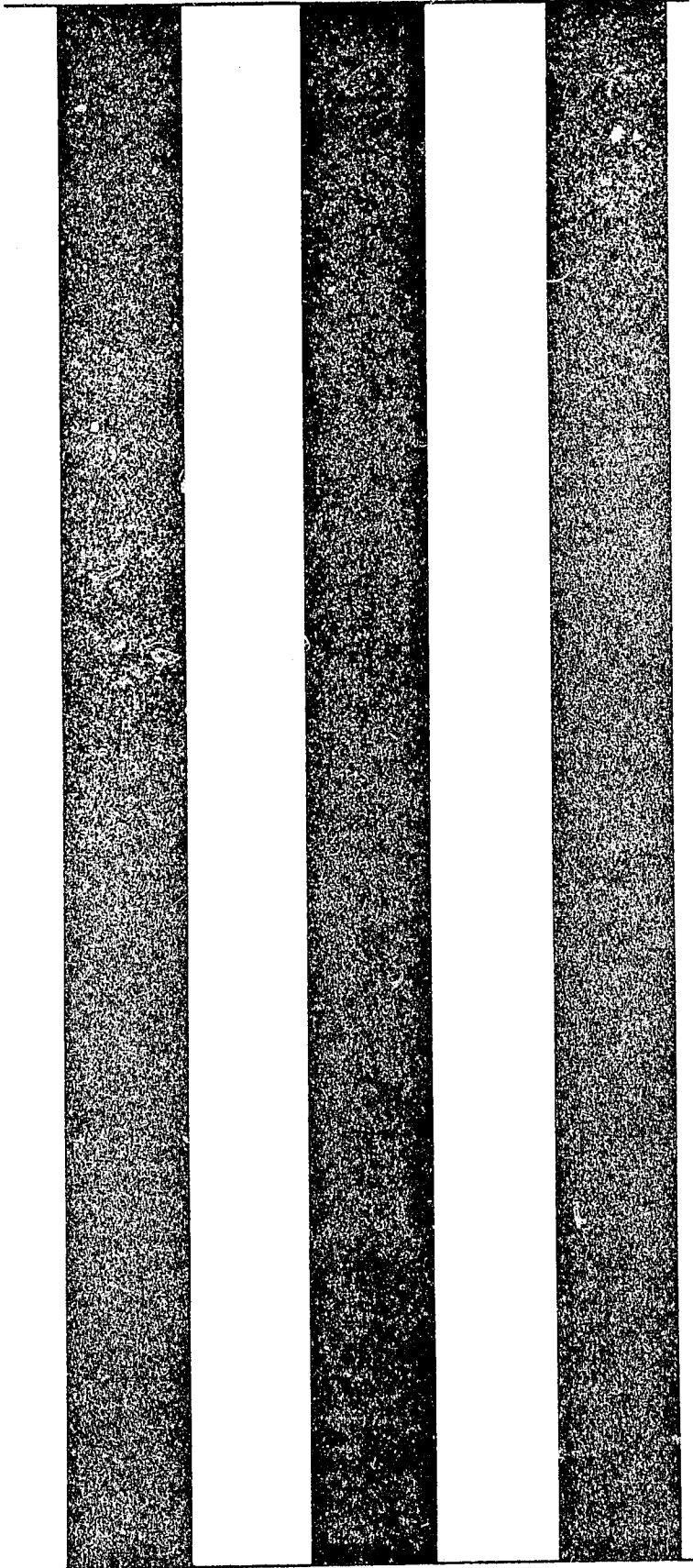

The Annual Crop Report for the County of Kern is submitted in accordance with Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code. This report covers the acreage, production and value of all agricultural crops produced in the county, including livestock and livestock products. Acreage of permanent crops is reported in actual bearing acres only, all other crops are reported in harvested acreage or rangeland.

From 695,445 planted acres and 2,700,000 acres of rangeland the total gross return to agriculture amounted to \$263,256,540, which is a twelve percent increase over the previous year.

Cotton again proved to be our most valuable crop, and a record was established with the production of 1276 pounds lint per acre. This surpassed the previous high of 1213 pounds lint per acre in 1957, and is 75 percent higher than the production of ten years ago. Such a record is certainly a tribute to the cotton farmers of Kern County and also attests to the superior strain of Acala 4-42 grown in our One Variety Cotton District.

Over four thousand additional acres of grapevines came into production in 1962. Prices on table stock were lower than a year ago, but raisin and wine grapes brought better returns and the total valuation of the entire crop was increased by sixteen percent.

Potato acreage and yield both decreased in 1962. Returns were higher than the 1961 season; however, reported f.o.b. prices did not necessarily reflect the true gross return to growers. Many shipments rolled unsold and brought lower returns from consignment sales. In addition, there was considerable adjustment of f.o.b. prices in 1962 due to quality difficulties.

Alfalfa hay prices fluctuated widely throughout the year, but the final estimate for the season amounted to \$22 per ton and brought a total return of 21 percent more than the year previous.

It is estimated by the California Crop and Livestock Reporting Service that approximately 288,000 head of beef cattle were marketed through Kern County feed yards during the past year. Only that portion of the total liveweight which was actually produced in Kern County has been taken into consideration for this report, and with an increase in both production and value the total returns were increased by 23 percent. Sheep men received a better price for their increased production, and the poultry industry also showed a gain.

In addition to the items mentioned there were seventeen other crops which brought returns of over one million dollars each into the county. These are as follows: barley, dry beans, irrigated pasture, safflower, silage, sorghum grain, sugar beets, wheat, certified ranger alfalfa seed, sweet corn, cantaloupes, onions, peaches, plums, nursery stock, milk and eggs.

All prices used in this crop report are based on f.o.b. market values and do not represent the net amount received by growers. From this income must be deducted the cost of production and preparation for market.

Our sincere thanks is extended to all those who cooperated with this department by furnishing information and statistics and thus making this report possible.
