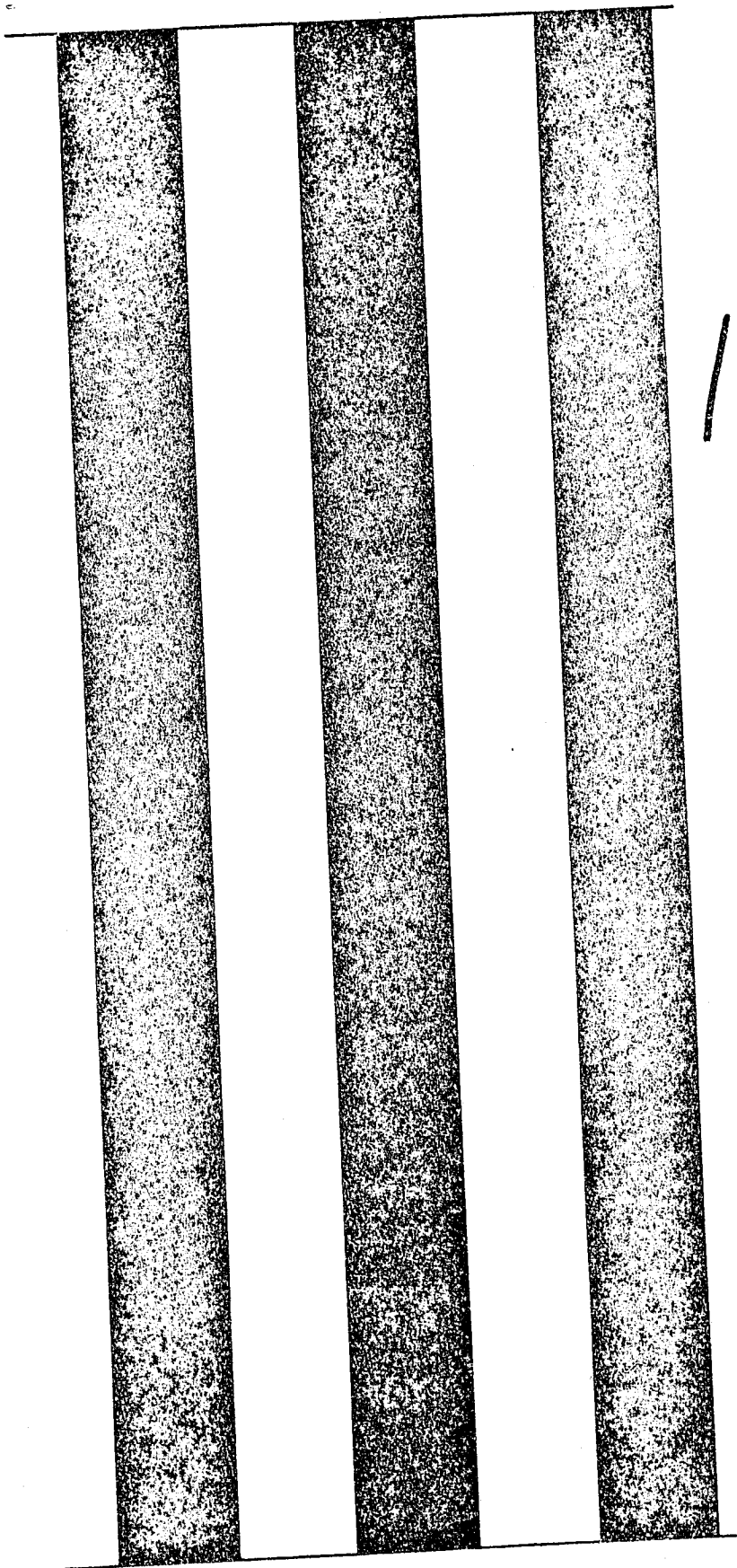

Section 65.5 of the California Agricultural Code requires the Agricultural Commissioner to compile a report covering conditions, acreage, production, and value of the agricultural products of his county.

This crop report shows a gross return to the lumber companies, ranchers and farmers, the beef report including purebred stock. As before, lumber is the most valuable crop, the value being greater this year although the output in board feet was less.

The value of livestock and wool was practically the same as last year. Winter feed was not too short due to the fact ample amount is put up in case of severe winters.

Alfalfa seed production was three times greater than last year, the tendency being for the producer to swing over into the seed end rather than hay.

We sincerely appreciate the assistance received from the various Federal, State, and County Agencies, and individuals in making this crop report possible.

I hereby submit the 1950 annual crop report as required by Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code of the State of California.

This annual report shows the commodity, acreage, production and the gross value of these crops as well as the totals of previous crop reports. There has been a gradual increase in gross returns for the past seven years which is mostly due to the rise in prices rather than to an increase in production.

Lumber continues to take first place and livestock second. Livestock shows about one million dollars more this year due to the advance in price. A late freeze reduced the apple crop to a few hundred boxes.

I sincerely appreciate the information furnished us by the growers and various agencies in making the compilation of this report possible.

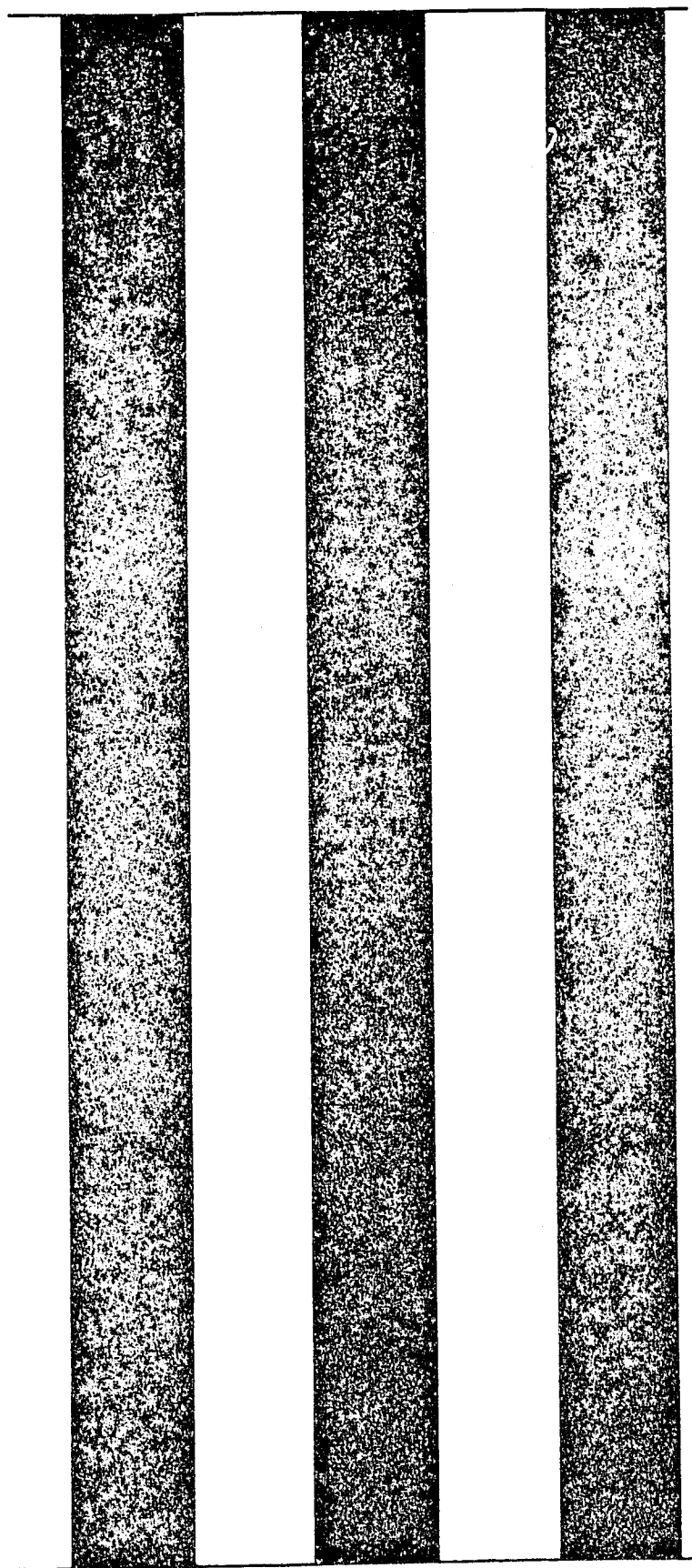

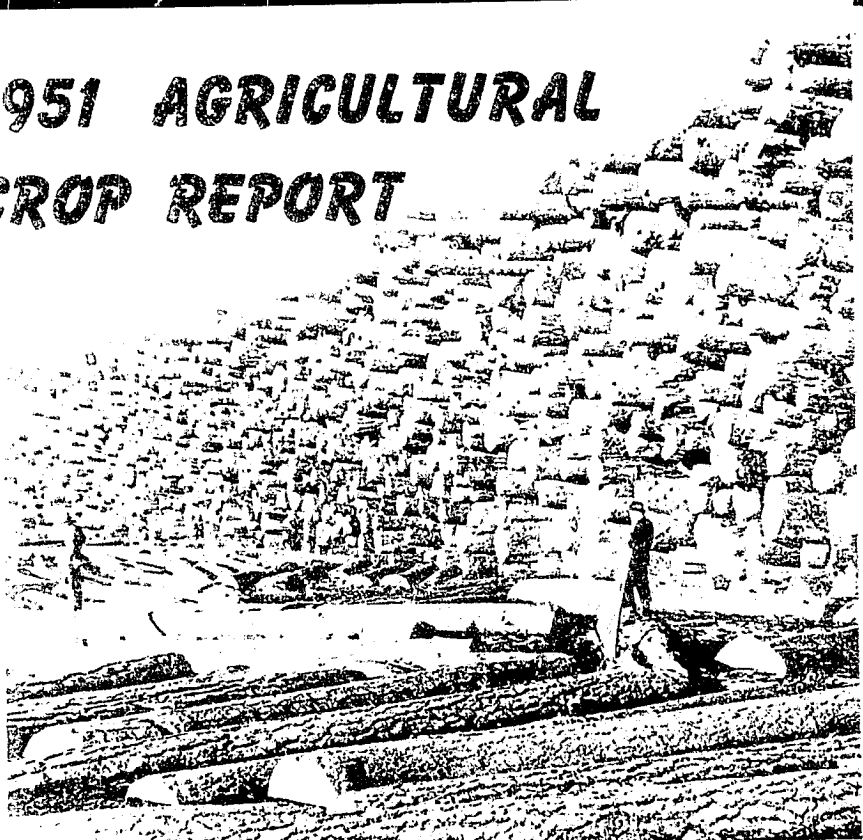
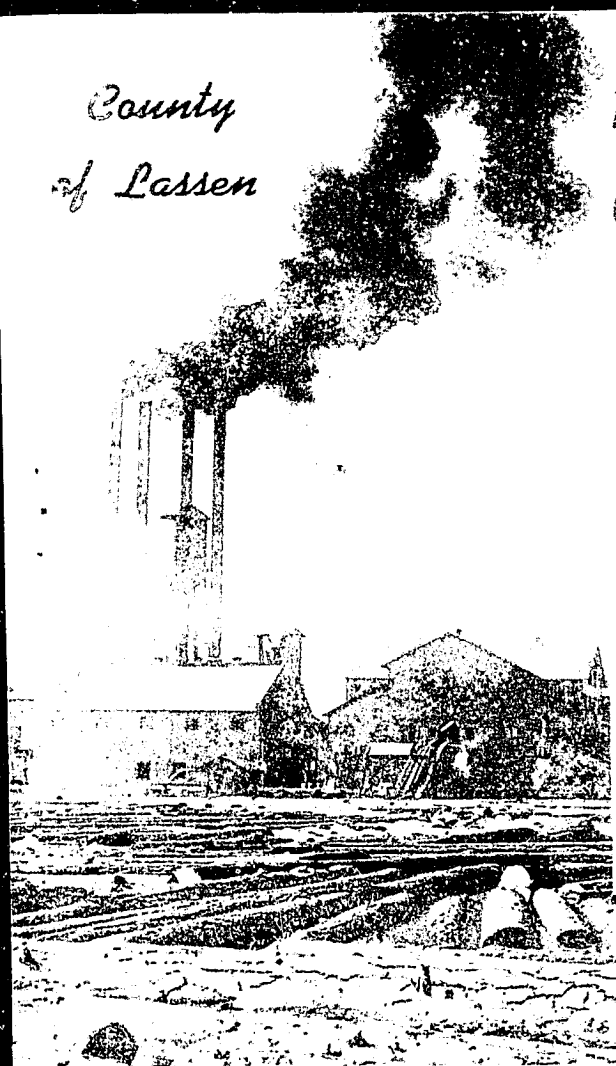

Section 65.5 of the California Agricultural Code requires that the Agricultural Commissioner compile a report covering conditions, acreage, production and value of the Agricultural products of his county.

This eighth annual crop report consists of gross prices received by the farmers for their commodities. In most cases the production is the same as last year but the increase in price shows a substantial climb over last year.

Severe frost damage was caused to fruit and berry crops. Less acreage was planted in potatoes than last year. Lumber production remained about the same but the price increased the total value about two million dollars over last year.

To those who helped supply the data for this report the Lassen County Department of Agriculture expresses their deep appreciation.
