Gentlemen:

In compliance with Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code I am publishing this report showing the Acreage, Production, and the Values of the agricultural products of Placer County for the year 1951.

These 1951 agricultural returns were the highest in the history of Placer County. However, it should not reflect that the farmer's profits were the greatest, as the cost of production, has risen accordingly.

The high returns can be traced to a very good range-pasture year, and the expansion of the livestock industry, along with rising meat prices. The price of plums was very satisfactory from mid-season on and the total returns from pears, although about the same as last year would have been higher had it not been for considerable hail damage. Forestry production returns figured on a stumpage basis brought in \$1,033,509.00 and have been added to this report for the first time because of the many requests for this information.

The values shown are based on the price the grower received at his ranch after harvesting but before the packing charges, brokerage, freight and other costs are added. Had these additional charges been added, the totals would have been much greater as many industries in Placer County are dependant on the farmer's produce from the time it leaves his ranch, and until it reaches the eastern markets.

I wish to publicly thank the Packing House Managers, the Division of Forestry, the Agricultural Extension Service, and members of the Farm Bureau whose helpful cooperation made this report more accurate and complete.




You will note that the total returns to Placer County were \$711,083.00 more than in 1951, although the net gain to the individual farmer was probably less due to the higher cost of production than ever before.

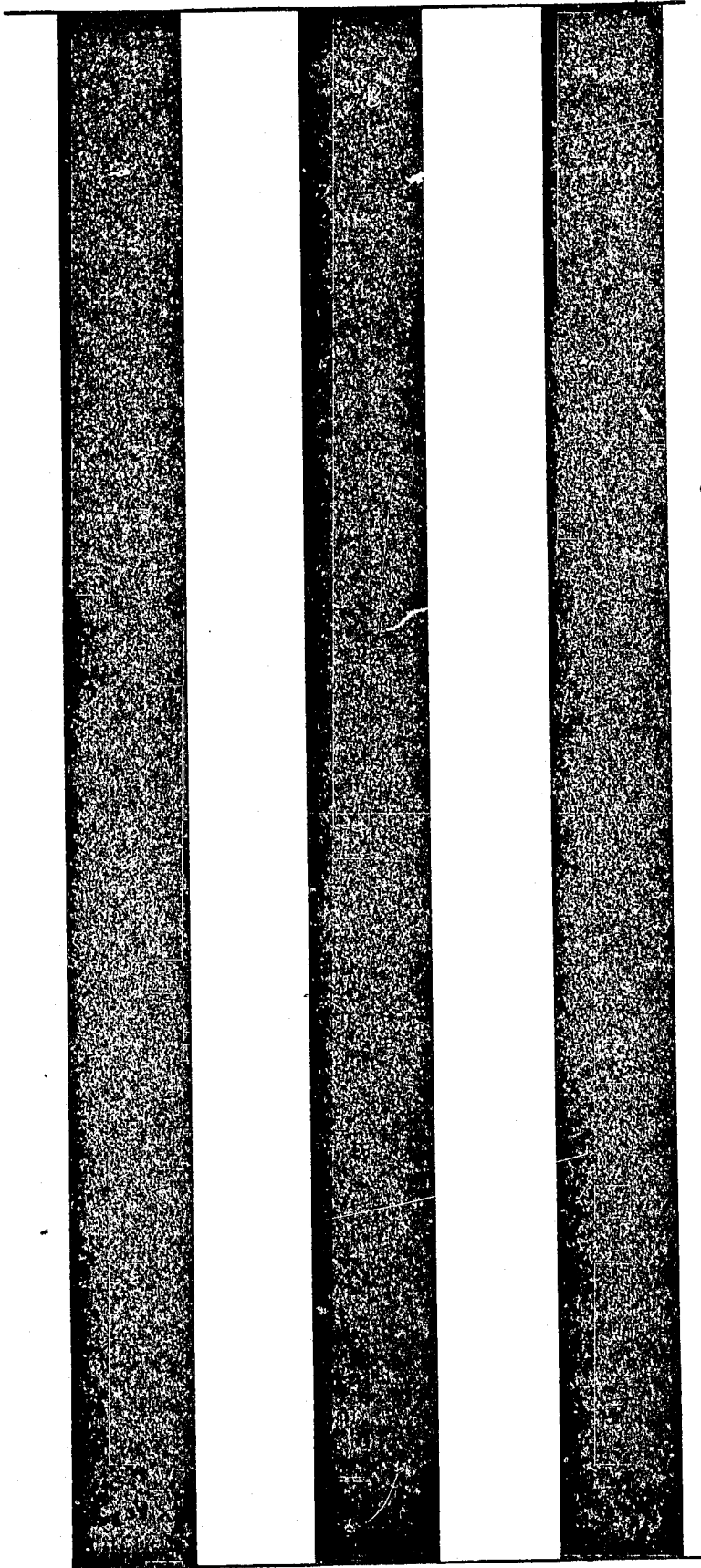


In accordance with the requirements of Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code, I am submitting this report of the acreage, production, and values of Agricultural Crops produced in Placer County during the year of 1954.

Returns to growers for the year showed an increase of \$1,092,830 over 1953, due primarily to higher prices for plums and pears, our two principal orchard crops, and the greater production of rice, which shows a total acreage of 10,500, or 2,640 acres more than in 1953. Prices for other crops remained about the same, except the returns from livestock products which were considerably lower than in 1953.

This report has been compiled from packing house records, buyers' and sellers' receipts, our own inspection records, and other government agencies. Values shown are not net returns, but are based on the average seasonal price per unit the farmer received for his product at his ranch. They do not include costs of marketing, such as shock, packing, freight, brokerage, etc., which represent separate industries that are dependent on the farmers' ability to produce a profitable crop annually.

I wish to thank all those who cooperated by making records and information available for this report.

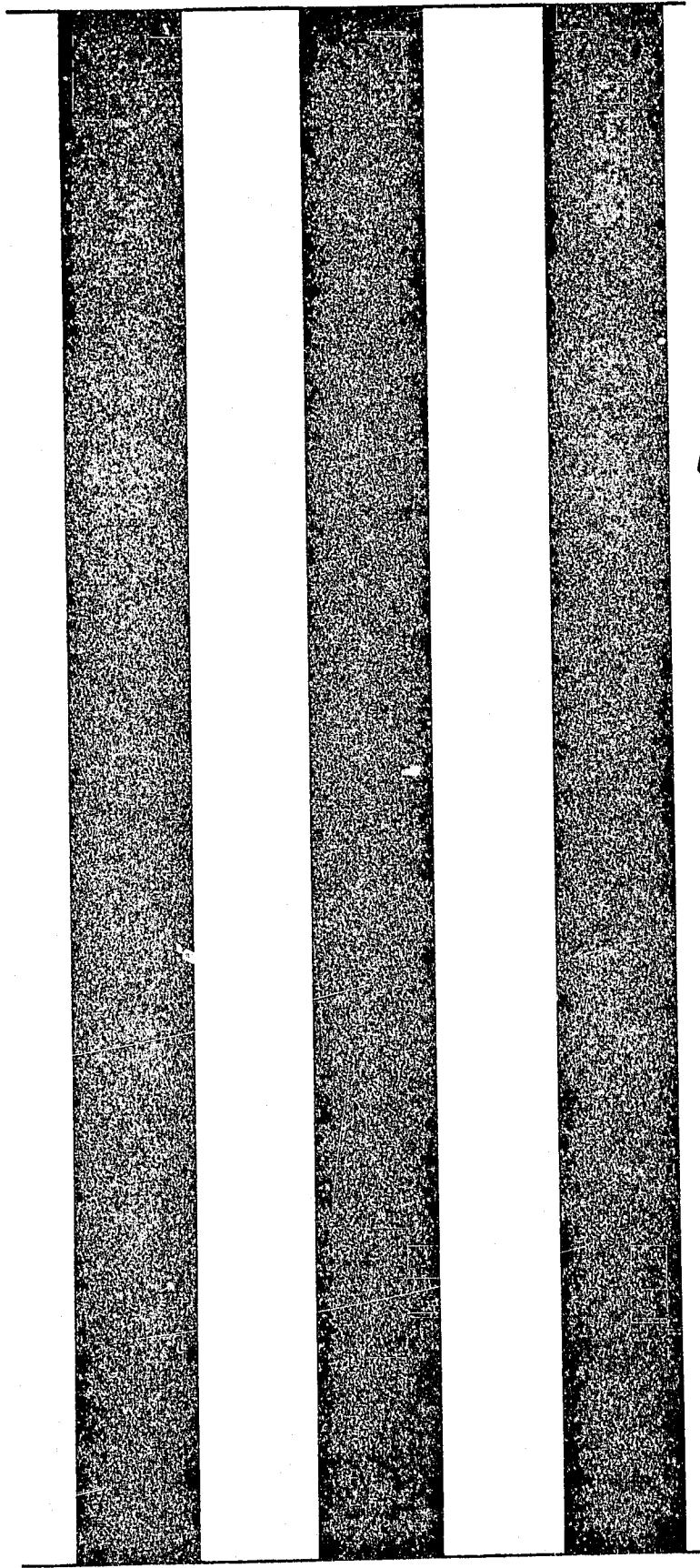

This is the Annual Crop Report, as required by Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code, which covers the acreage, production, and values of the agricultural production of Placer County for the year 1955.

The total financial return to our farmers was \$16,223,629.00 which was \$1,173,867.00 less than the year of 1954. This was expected after noting that prices for plums, and livestock were considerable lower. Our pear crop was not of its usual high quality due to poor weather conditions, and our rice acreage was limited to slightly over half of the previous year.

Notable increases were made in the nursery production, forestry, and poultry business.

The values shown represent the gross return to farmers after harvesting, but before being packed and prepared for transport to the markets.

I am submitting the 1958 Agricultural Crop Report of Placer County as required by Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code.

Total income from all agricultural products was \$19,476,001.00. This was \$75,702.00 less than in 1957. Continuous rains during the blossoming seasons was responsible for the reduced tonnage of our fruit and nut crops as well as our field crops. However, the increased income from our livestock almost offset this deficiency.

The values shown in this report are not the net returns to the farmers, but are based on the F.O.B. farm prices. They do not include the cost of packing, hauling, brokerage, etc.
