

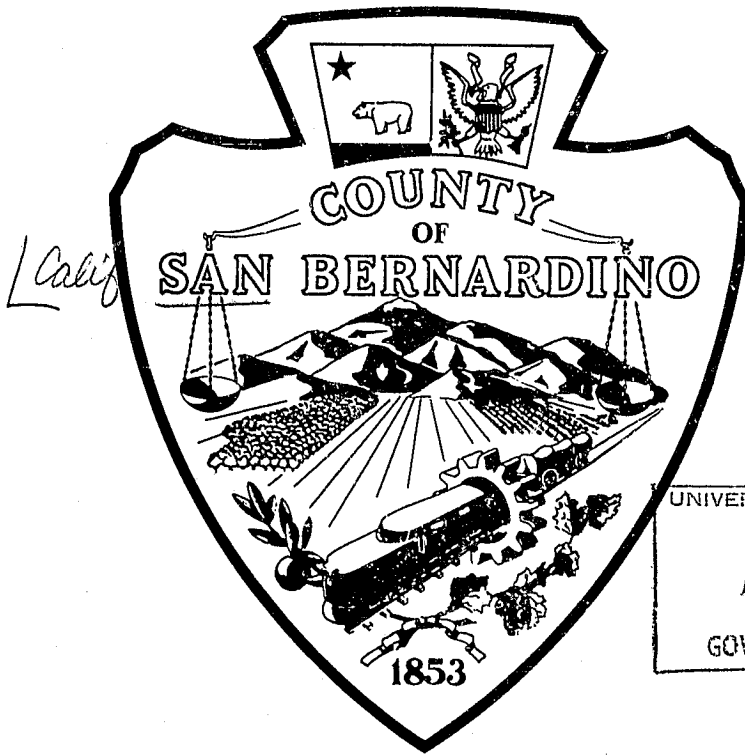

In compliance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the Agricultural Code of the State of California, I hereby submit the Annual Crop and Livestock Report for the year 1973, covering the conditions, acreage, production and value of the agricultural products for the County of San Bernardino.


The values in this report represent the gross value of commercial agricultural production in San Bernardino County. On this basis the total value of farm production in the county amounted to \$263,450,100 for 1973, as compared with \$192,433,300 for 1972.

This value is a 37 percent increase over the previous year and is the highest value on record for the county. The gross value of crops was \$48,836,100 as compared with \$35,390,600 for 1972. The estimated value of livestock production and products was \$214,614,000, an increase of over 57 million dollars. This record valuation can be attributed mainly to increased production and returns for all citrus, apples, wine grapes, alfalfa, cattle and calves, eggs and milk. There were 17 commodities produced in the county with a valuation in excess of one million dollars.

Although 1973 was a record year in gross value, production costs of many crops continued to rise as well. In many instances, however, the increase in cash receipts more than offset the increase in production expenses. Realized net farm income thus increased this year as it did in 1972. Agriculture thus continues to make a major contribution to the county's economy.

To the members of our department and others who contributed valuable information to make this report possible, we extend our sincere appreciation.

CROP AND LIVESTOCK ANALYSIS

Valuations given in this report for packed citrus are f.o.b. as fruit leaves the packing house. The season average price and value of other fresh market fruits are on the basis of equivalent returns at first delivery point or at roadside. Processed fruit price and value are on the basis of equivalent returns at processing plant door. Vegetable average price and value are on a packed and loaded basis f.o.b. shipping point. Values for feed lot cattle are figured on a weight gain basis while the remainder sold from the range, cull dairy stock and calves as well as other livestock are figured on the basis of full weight. Milk production and valuation figures were supplied by the Crop Reporting Service and are for commercial milk sales only. Egg prices are based on the overall average received by the producers with allowances being made for eggs sold direct to consumers.

Citrus: The total citrus acreage for San Bernardino County at the end of the year was 17,102 acres. This is a reduction of 753 acres from the previous year. Total citrus production was 9,067,000 cartons, including fruit sold for processing, an increase of 3,668,300 cartons over the previous season. This increase is mainly attributed to a bumper Valencia orange crop which more than doubled the previous year's production. Price returns for all citrus was \$22,899,000, an increase of over 9 million dollars.

Deciduous: Well spaced rains plus only slight deviations from normal temperatures was conducive to a very good year for deciduous fruits and vines. Apple production in the Oak Glen area was the best in several years as was the apricot crop in the desert. Total grape production was close to 4 tons per acre with continuing good returns at the winery. Peach, plum and walnut production remained about the same as last year.

Vegetable and Field Crops: A small reduction in vegetable acreage is noted although returns were up slightly. Increased plantings of barley, oats and wheat were responsible for an increase in total field crop acreage. Alfalfa yields also increased with record returns. Price increases are noted for practically all field crops as shown by the 2.5 million dollar or 40 percent jump from 1972.

Livestock: The estimated value of all livestock and poultry production was \$214,614,000, an increase of 57 million dollars over the previous year. This can be attributed to a return to normal production of eggs and higher receipts for all livestock items especially beef, eggs and milk. Total commercial milk production in San Bernardino County for 1973 was 16,521,600 cwt. or 192,112,000 gallons. The value of this high production figure was \$112,305,000, an increase of near 16 million dollars over 1972. Average price paid to producers increased 94 cents per hundredweight. The total number of dairies at year's end was 317, a reduction of 9 from the previous year. This reduction is attributed mainly to the consolidation of smaller dairies plus some movement out of county. Of this total number of dairies 302 are located in the Chino-Ontario area, one of the largest concentrations in the world. San Bernardino County thus continues to be the leading milk producer in the nation.

Egg production returned to normal following the Newcastle disease outbreak that took its toll in layers in 1972. Inventory figures at the end of the year reveal a return to the average 6,500,000 layers of the past few years. Increased egg prices are reflected in the 31 million dollar increase in the valuation. The county thus returns to rank high in the state in egg production. Total value of all poultry and eggs was over 79 million dollars.



Gentlemen:

Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code requires the County Agricultural Commissioner to submit an annual report of the acreage, production and value of the agricultural products of his county. This report fulfills that requirement for San Bernardino County for the year 1974.

The total gross value of agricultural crops and products for 1974 was \$285,603,600, an increase of approximately \$22,153,500 over 1973 production and is the highest gross receipts ever recorded for this county. The record year can be attributed mainly to an increase in milk valuation. It should be emphasized that the cost of production in two of our leading products was extremely high. The high cost of feed substantially widens the differential between gross and net earnings.

I extend my appreciation to the individuals and organizations who supplied the information that made this report possible and to the staff members who gathered and assembled the data.

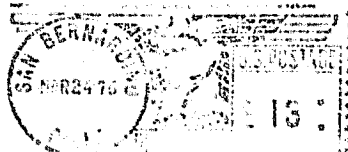


Gentlemen:



This year's new record total is \$343,265,800. This represents an eleven percent increase over the previous year. The County also retains its number one position in milk production as the total milk valuation rose seventeen million dollars over 1975. With the addition of Sudan grass, the list of crops exceeding one million dollars in value now totals 19. I would like to emphasize that the figures in this report indicate gross returns and in no way reflect the producer's net earnings.

My appreciation is extended to those individuals and organizations who supplied the necessary information to make this report possible.

CROP AND LIVESTOCK ANALYSIS

Valuations given in this report for packed citrus are f.o.b. as fruit leaves the packing house. The season average price and value of other fresh market fruits are on the basis of equivalent returns at first delivery point or at roadside. Processed fruit price and value are on the basis of equivalent returns at processing plant door. Vegetable average price and value are on a packed and loaded basis f.o.b. shipping point. Values for feed lot cattle are figured on a weight gain basis while the remainder sold from the range, cull dairy stock and calves as well as other livestock are figured on the basis of full weight. Milk production and valuation figures were supplied by the Crop Reporting Service and are for commercial milk sales only. Egg prices are based on the overall average received by the producers with allowances being made for eggs sold direct to consumers.

Citrus: The total citrus acreage for San Bernardino County at the end of the year was 13,469 acres. This is a reduction of 1524 acres from the previous year. Total citrus production was 5,914,900 cartons, including fruit sold for processing, an increase of 616,500 cartons over the previous season. This increase is mainly attributed to a 53 percent rise in navel orange production over last year. The average carton price for navel oranges, however, was 22 cents under that of last season. Price returns for all citrus were \$14,302,000, an increase of nearly 1.7 million dollars.

Deciduous: An unusual tropical storm during harvest caused an overall light and poor quality grape crop. Internal breakdown, due to the warm, wet weather prevented shipping of Zinfandels and lowered harvested acreage of other varieties. Lighter yields for all varieties and lower prices for the Zinfandel variety decreased the grape valuation \$344,000 under last year. Generally, 1976 was a good year for the other deciduous fruits. Apples, apricots, cherries, pears, and plums increased in production from a year ago and combined, enjoyed a higher crop valuation.

Vegetable and Field Crops: Vegetable crop value was up \$496,300 over the previous year but acreage increased only slightly. Higher crop valuation is due mainly to specialty crops. Field crop plantings overall decreased some 1400 acres. Dry, winter weather significantly reduced dry land grain crops and range acreage. The drought was statewide contributing to higher values for most field crops. Returns increased \$2,252,000 due to the demand.

Livestock: The estimated value of all livestock and poultry production was \$297,942,000 an increase of 30 million dollars over the previous year. This can be attributed to higher production and returns for milk and eggs. Total commercial milk production in San Bernardino County for 1976 was 20,112,900 cwt. or 233,871,000 gallons. The value of this high production figure was \$190,040,000, an increase of 17.3 million dollars over 1975. The total number of dairies at year's end was 300, a reduction of 5 from the previous year. This reduction is mainly due to the consolidation of smaller dairies. Of this total number of dairies 283 are located in the Chino-Ontario area, one of the largest concentrations in the world. San Bernardino County thus continues to be the leading milk producer in the nation.

Egg production per laying hen has increased by 17 eggs per year. Even though inventory figures at the end of the year reveal 200,000 fewer layers, a 4.6 million dozen production increase is noted. Increased egg prices are also reflected in the 12.6 million dollar increase in the valuation. Total value of all poultry and eggs was over 85 million dollars.

Pursuant to Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I hereby submit the San Bernardino County Annual Crop and Livestock Report for 1977.

For the ninth consecutive year a new record valuation is noted. This year's total is \$354,037,000, which represents a 3.4 per cent increase over the previous year. The number one position in milk production is retained by our County with an additional 13.6 million dollars estimated for this product for 1977. The list of crops exceeding one million dollars in value totals 17. Hogs and pigs, baby chicks, apples and Sudan grass have been dropped from the list. Strawberries along with sheep and lambs are new crops added having valuations over one million dollars. Nursery crop returns increased the most in percentage by advancing from 5.6 to 8.5 million dollars. It should be mentioned that values in this report represent gross returns and do not reflect the producer's net earnings.

Sincere appreciation is extended to members of our department and to other individuals and organizations who provided pertinent information to make this report possible.

CROP AND LIVESTOCK ANALYSIS

Valuations given in this report for packed citrus are f.o.b. as fruit leaves the packing house. The season average price and value of other fresh market fruits are on the basis of equivalent returns at first delivery point or at roadside. Processed fruit price and value are on the basis of equivalent returns at processing plant door. Vegetable average price and value are on a packed and loaded basis f.o.b. shipping point. Values for feed lot cattle are figured on a weight gain basis while the remainder sold from the range, cull dairy stock and calves as well as other livestock are figured on the basis of full weight. Milk production and valuation figures were supplied by the Crop Reporting Service and are for commercial milk sales only. Egg prices are based on the overall average received by the producers with allowances being made for eggs sold direct to consumers.

Citrus: The total citrus acreage for San Bernardino County at the end of the year was 12,419 acres. This is a reduction of 1050 acres from the previous year. Total citrus production was 5,687,300 cartons, including fruit sold for processing, a decrease of 227,600 cartons from last season. This decrease is attributed to lower production figures for Valencia oranges and grapefruit, although navel orange and lemon production was up by 247,000 cartons. With the exception of lemons, average carton prices exceeded those of last season. Price returns for all citrus were \$16,854,400, an increase of over 2.5 million dollars.

Deciduous: Total acreage continued to decline for deciduous crops. Wine grapes comprised the largest portion with a decrease of 1800 acres. Despite this reduction the grape value increased in 1977 as both production and price showed improvement over the unusually poor year of 1976. Yields for the remaining deciduous crops suffered severely due to a late spring frost which damaged the bloom during this critical period. Total valuation for all deciduous crops was \$585,000 lower than last year.

Vegetable and Field Crops: Vegetable crop acreage decreased slightly along with generally lower yields. This resulted in a total value of nearly \$320,000 under the previous year. Field crop acreage increased by 2000 acres although crop value was nearly 3 million dollars lower than in 1976. Prices for all field crops in general were low causing the decrease in valuation.

Livestock: The estimated value of all livestock and poultry production was \$306,964,900, an increase of 9.7 million dollars over the previous year. This can mainly be attributed to higher production and returns for market milk. Total commercial milk production in San Bernardino County for 1977 was 20,347,300 cwt. or 236,597,000 gallons. The value of this high production figure was \$203,223,000, which is 13.6 million dollars over 1976. The total number of dairies at year's end was 296, a reduction of 4 from the previous year. This reduction is mainly due to the consolidation of smaller dairies. Of this total number of dairies 283 are located in the Chino-Ontario area, one of the largest concentrations in the world. San Bernardino County thus continues to be the leading milk producer in the nation.

Inventory figures for laying hens reveal 100,000 less than in 1976. Estimated egg production was 127,500,000 dozen, a decrease of 2.1 million dozen from last year. Lower egg prices in 1977 are also reflected in the 3.8 million dollar decrease in the valuation. Total value of all poultry and eggs was over 82 million dollars.



Total citrus production was 5,282,800 cartons, including fruit sold for processing, a decrease of 404,500 cartons from last season. This decrease is attributed to lower production figures for navel oranges, grapefruit and lemons, although Valencia orange production was up by 373,000 cartons. Carton prices for all citrus varieties exceeded those of last season. Total citrus valuation was \$17,646,000, an increase of nearly .8 million dollars.

Deciduous: The decline in deciduous crop acreage leveled off with only a few plantings removed in 1978. Apple production was nearly twice that of the previous year, while prices were somewhat lower. The gross value increased despite the lower prices. Grape values climbed due to improved yields and prices. Overall total value for deciduous crops increased by 1.5 million dollars.

Vegetable and Field Crops: Vegetable crop valuation was \$722,300 over 1977. Contributing to this were higher average prices and a slight increase in planted acreage. Field crop acreage increased nearly 13,000 acres, while prices were generally lower. Total valuation for all field crops increased slightly.

Livestock: The estimated value of all livestock and poultry production was \$332,747,400, an increase of nearly 21.8 million dollars over the previous year. This is mainly attributable to higher production and returns for market milk as well as higher overall returns for livestock. Total commercial milk production in San Bernardino County for 1978 was 21,328,300 cwt. or 248,003,000 gallons. The value for this high production was \$222,283,000, which is 15.1 million dollars over 1977. The total number of dairies at year's end was 303, an increase of 7 over the previous year. Of this total number of dairies 290 are located in the Chino-Ontario area, one of the largest concentrations in the world. San Bernardino County thus continues to be the leading milk producer in the nation.

Inventory figures for laying hens show 100,000 more than in 1977. Estimated egg production was 129,625,000 dozen, an increase of 2.1 million dozen over last year. Lower egg prices in 1978 are reflected in the nearly 3.8 million dollar decrease in the valuation. Total value of all poultry and eggs was nearly 77 million dollars.

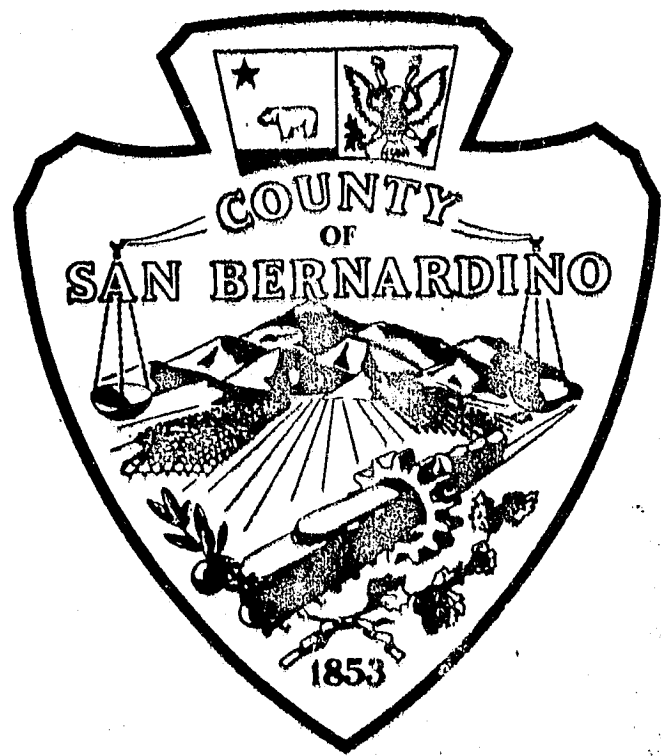

Pursuant to Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the San Bernardino County Annual Crop and Livestock Report for 1979.

The gross value of all agricultural production in San Bernardino County during 1979 totaled \$436,931,600, a 13.1 percent increase over the previous year. Despite serious freezing damage to citrus incurred in December 1978 and January 1979, this is the eleventh consecutive year for a new record valuation. The number one position in milk production is retained by our County with an additional 39 million dollars estimated for this product. The list of crops exceeding one million dollars in value now totals 20. Apiary products have been dropped from the list while apples and strawberries were added.

It must be emphasized that values in this report are for gross returns only, and in no way are a measure of the producer's net earnings.

I wish to express appreciation to my staff, related agencies and members of the agricultural industry for their contributions in the compilation of this report.

CROP AND LIVESTOCK ANALYSIS

Valuations given in this report for packed citrus are f.o.b. as fruit leaves the packing house. The season average price and value of other fresh market fruits are on the basis of equivalent returns at first delivery point or at roadside. Processed fruit price and value are on the basis of equivalent returns at processing plant door. Vegetable average price and value are on a packed and loaded basis f.o.b. shipping point. Values for feed lot cattle are calculated on a weight gain basis while the remainder sold from the range, cull dairy stock and calves as well as other livestock are figured on the basis of full weight. Milk production and valuation figures are for commercial milk sales only. Egg prices are based on the overall average received by the producers with allowances being made for eggs sold direct to consumers.

Citrus: The total citrus acreage for San Bernardino County at the end of the year was 11,092 acres. This is a reduction of 252 acres from the previous year. Total citrus production was 2,386,200 cartons, a decrease of 2,896,600 cartons from last season. This decrease of nearly 55 percent is attributed to a severe frost which occurred in December, 1978. Many groves were left unpicked or abandoned for the season, and much of the harvested fruit was seriously damaged. Demand for citrus fruit resulted in higher carton prices than those of last year. Total citrus valuation was \$9,335,000, a decrease of \$8,311,000 from the 1978 figure.

Deciduous: Deciduous crop acreage continued to decline with a net loss of approximately 153 acres in 1979. Apple production increased slightly with prices remaining nearly the same as the previous year. Wine grape values climbed due primarily to higher yields. The overall value for deciduous crops increased by \$717,000.

Vegetable and Field Crops: Vegetable crop valuation was \$693,600 over 1978. This higher value is attributed to increased average prices for the commodities. Field crop acreage dropped about 10,000 acres while prices were significantly higher than 1978 figures. The field crop acreage decrease was due to less acreage planted and a smaller number of cattle grazing on fewer dry range acres. Total valuation for all field crops was \$4,590,000 over the previous year.

Livestock: The estimated value of all livestock and poultry production was \$10,333,900, an increase of \$56,639,900 over the 1978 total. This is mainly attributable to higher production and returns for both market milk and chicken eggs. Higher overall returns for livestock also contributed significantly to this year's increased valuation. Total commercial milk production in San Bernardino County for 1979 was 22,939,400 cwt. or 266,737,000 gallons. The value for this high production was \$261,289,000, which is \$39,006,000 over 1978. The total number of dairies at year's end was 304. Of this total number of dairies 290 are located in the Chino-Ontario area, one of the largest concentrations in the world. San Bernardino County thus continues to be the leading milk producer in the nation.

Inventory figures for laying hens show 50,000 more than in 1978. Estimated egg production was 130,688,000 dozen, an increase of approximately one million dozen over last year. Higher egg prices in 1979 are also reflected in the \$5,704,000 increase in the valuation. Total value of all poultry and eggs was \$82,642,000.
