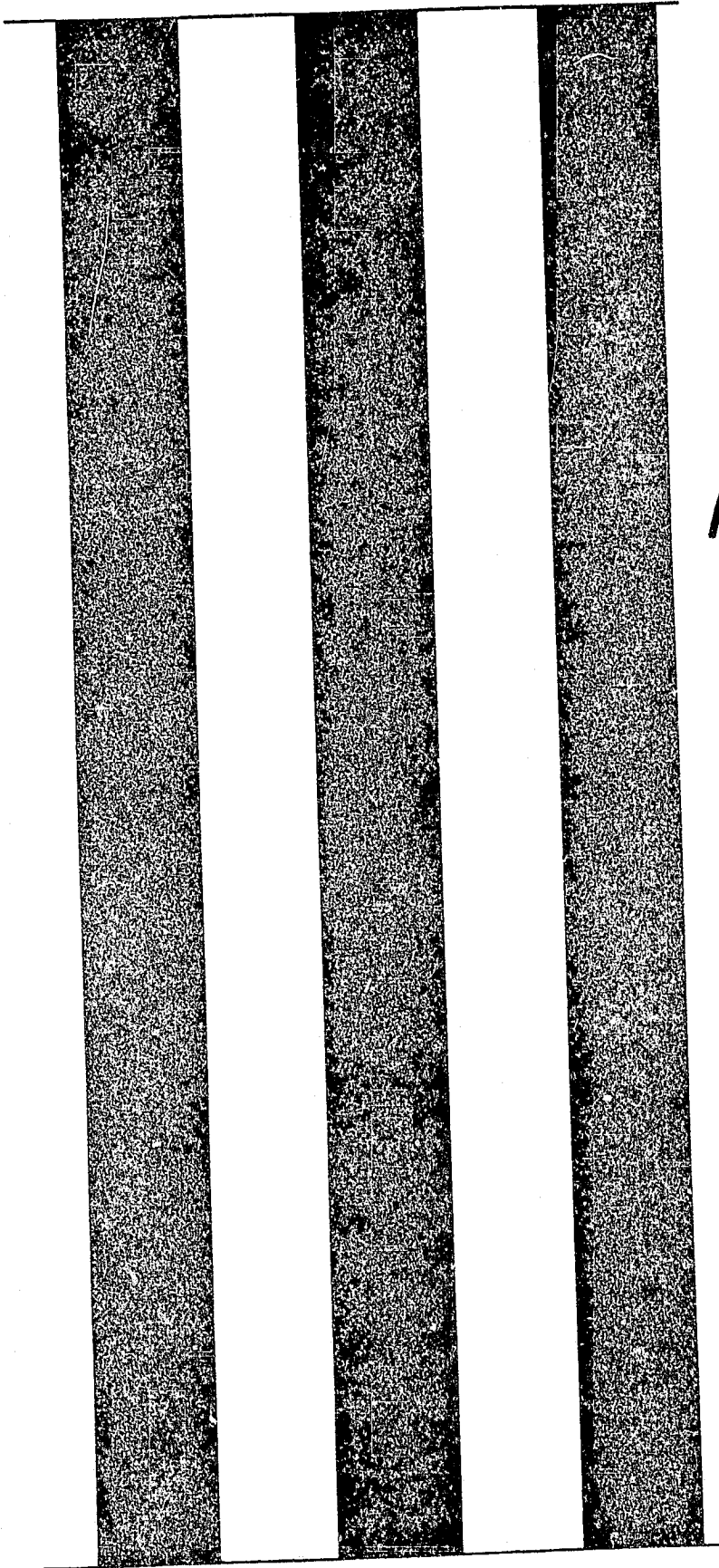

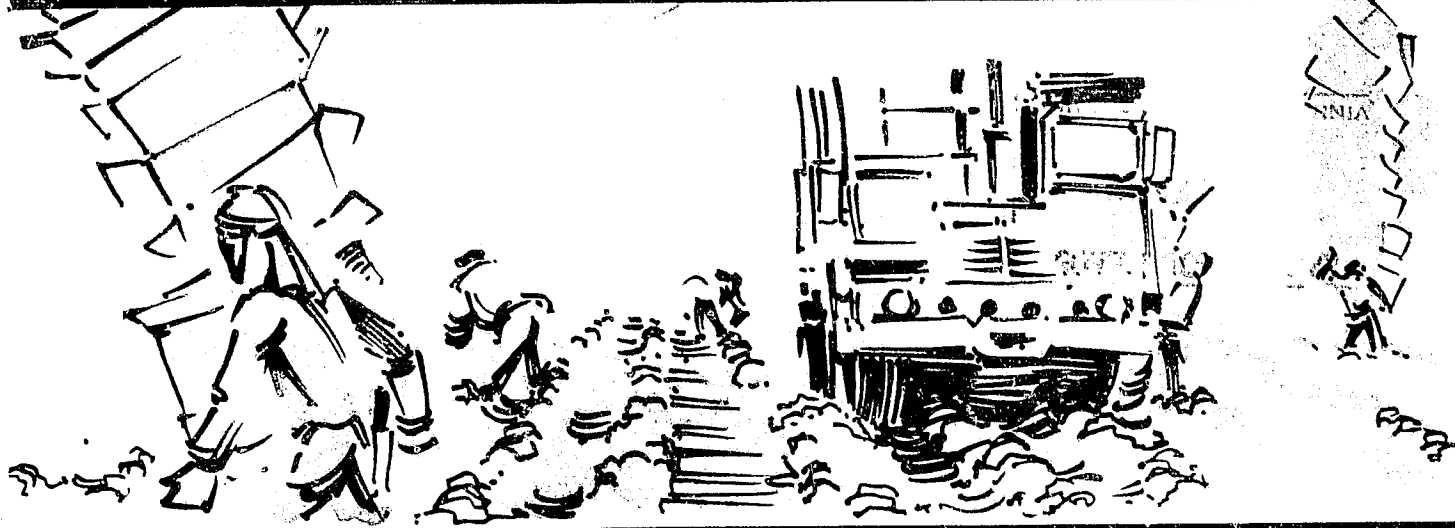

The cover

. depicts the multi-million dollar lettuce industry of Santa Barbara County.

The area's first commercial lettuce plantings began in the early 1920's.

This industry has enjoyed steady growth, and the Santa Barbara County area is recognized throughout marketing channels in California and the United States.

Lettuce gained the status of the County's number one commodity for the year 1978 in terms of value, with gross sales exceeding 23 million dollars.

Gentlemen:

As a result of the diversification of Santa Barbara County agriculture, the year 1979 saw a record gross value in production of \$248,025,887. This is an increase over 1978 in excess of forty million dollars.

Agriculture, the County's number one industry, is not dependent on just a few major commodities to provide this strong economic base. Sixteen of the top twenty cash products statewide are raised commercially in Santa Barbara County. Agriculture, through its multiplier effect, had a total financial impact in Santa Barbara County of nearly two-thirds of a billion dollars in 1979.

The figures of the report are gross values. Even though the economy of Santa Barbara County benefited through the gross agricultural industry increase, record high production costs in 1979 due to inflation must be subtracted to determine net income.

I would like to thank Joe Betz, Deputy Agricultural Commissioner, who coordinated the computation of this report with the help of staff members.

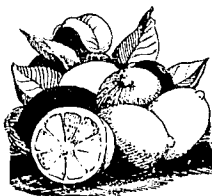

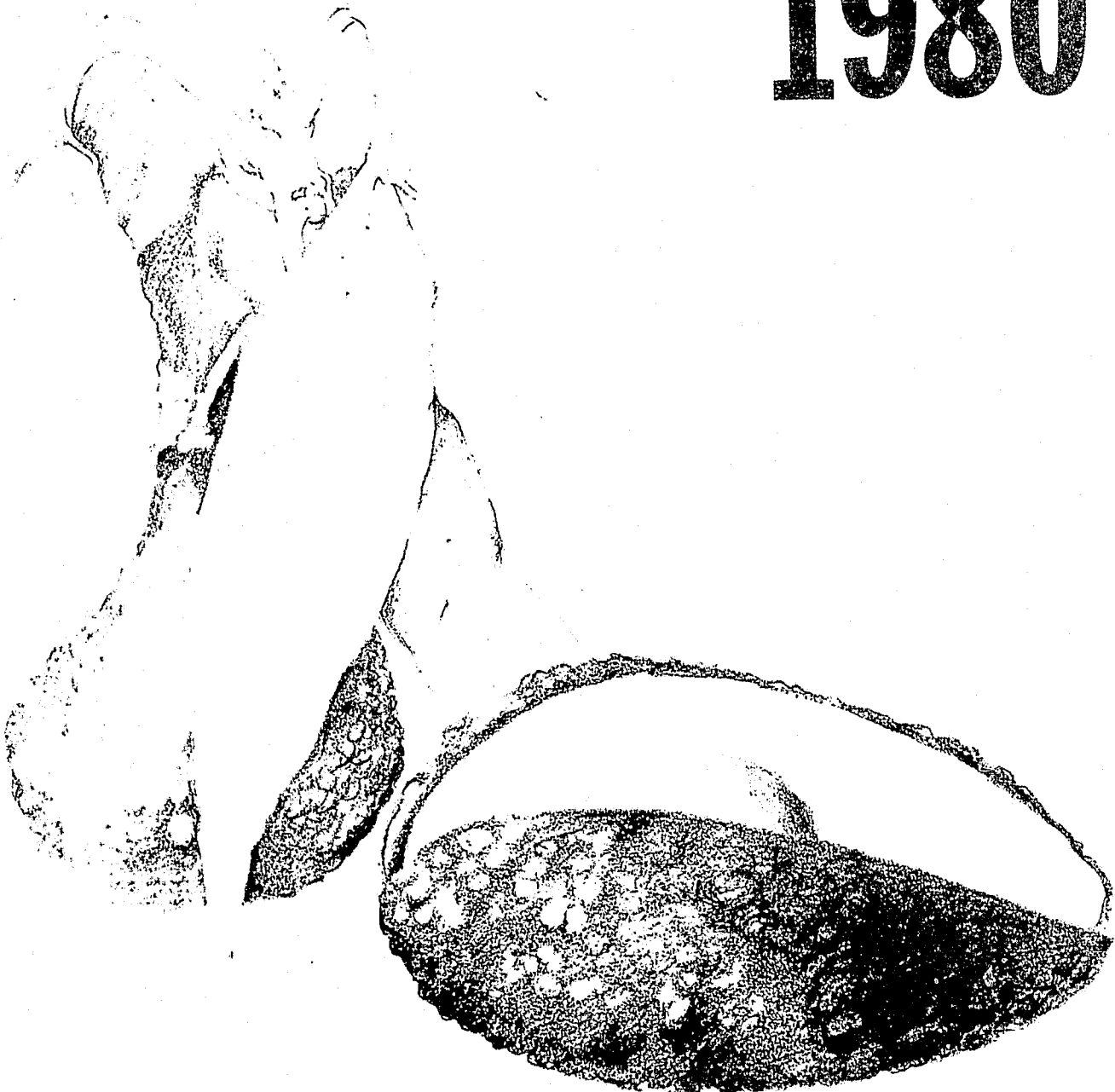

The distinction of having been among the very first to plant the avocado successfully in California is shared by Kinton Stevens of Montecito and Judge Ord of Santa Barbara, who imported three trees from Mexico in 1871. (California Avocado Association Yearbook, 1936).

Over one hundred years later, the avocado gained the status of the County's number one commodity in terms of value, with gross sales exceeding 55 million dollars in 1980.

Gentlemen:


Agriculture continues to be the largest producing industry in Santa Barbara County, with a gross production value for 1980 of \$300,018,428. This is an increase over the 1979 value of over fifty million dollars.

The diversity of our agriculture provides a strong economic base with this production value, through its multiplier effect, having an impact on our local economy of over three-quarters of a billion dollars. This diversity is illustrated by the 37 different commodities grown in Santa Barbara County which exceed a million dollars in value.

The figures in this report are gross values, and in no way reflect net income. Inflation, especially in the area of energy costs, continue to drastically increase the production costs of agriculture, and these costs must be subtracted from the gross values to determine the net income.

I wish to express my appreciation for the continuing cooperation of all the growers and organizations who contributed the information necessary for this report, and a special thanks to members of my staff who assisted in compiling it under the direction of Joe Betz, Deputy Agricultural Commissioner.

. depicts the multi-million dollar broccoli industry of Santa Barbara County.

This versatile vegetable has been grown and consumed in Europe for 2,000 years.

Italian Sprouting Broccoli has been grown in America for over 200 years, however it was not recognized commercially until the early 1920's.

The first commercial plantings of broccoli in Santa Barbara County were recorded in 1930. From this beginning the industry has developed rapidly, attaining recognition in the fresh and frozen market channels throughout California and the United States. This years gross receipts amounted to over 27 million dollars, making broccoli one of the leading crops produced in the county.


Agriculture continues to be the largest producing industry in Santa Barbara County, with a gross production value for 1981 of \$303,518,726. This is an increase over the 1980 value of over 3½ million dollars.

The diversity of our agriculture provides a strong economic base with this production value, through its multiplier effect, having an impact on our local economy of over three-quarters of a billion dollars. This diversity is illustrated by the 36 different commodities grown in Santa Barbara County which exceed a million dollars in value.

The figures in this report are gross values, and in no way reflect net income. Inflation, especially in the area of energy costs, continues to drastically increase the production costs of agriculture, and these costs must be subtracted from the gross values to determine the net income.

I wish to express my appreciation for the continuing cooperation of all the growers and organizations who contributed the information necessary for this report, and a special thanks to members of my staff who assisted in compiling it.

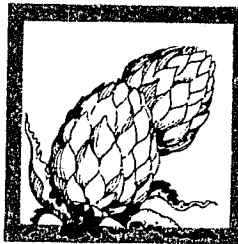
