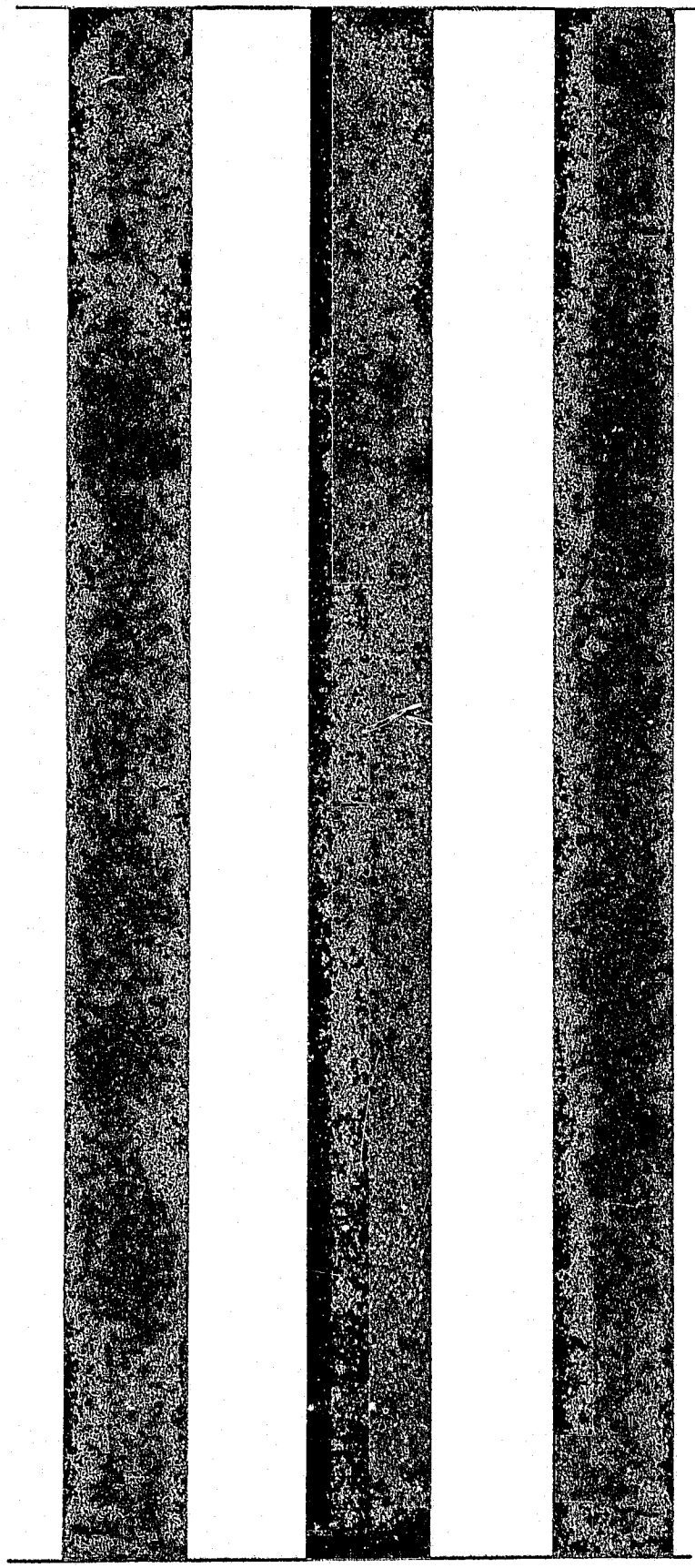


GENTLEMEN:



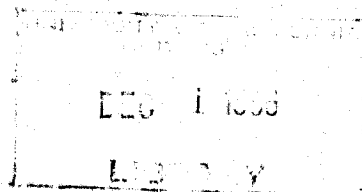

Gentlemen:

I herewith submit the Yuba County Agricultural Crop Report for the year 1965. This report is required under provisions of Section 65.5 of the California Agricultural Code and represents the gross returns from the sale of farm commodities determined as near as possible at the point of production.

A loss of over 2 million dollars from the 1964 total value is indicated. Adverse weather conditions occurring at critical periods during the production season seriously reduced the pear and peach crops and was responsible for some lowering of prune quality. Other crops were generally considered as normal.

Federal incentive, conservation and other support payments are listed herein but are not included in the totals.

My appreciation and acknowledgement is expressed to Earnie E. Vickrey, Deputy Agricultural Commissioner, and members of the staff for the compilation of this report.

The Agricultural Extension Service, officers of Federal and State farm agencies, farmers and many others have furnished pertinent crop information which has been most valuable in developing this report and to them we express our sincere thanks.

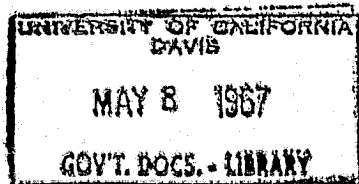


Total crop value for the year 1966 reached a new high level exceeding last years total by virtually three million dollars and exceeding the previous all time high of 1964 by over three quarters of a million dollars.

Significant gains were made in the category of fruit and nut crops due to favorable production conditions and increased bearing acreage. Production and value of rice took a substantial upturn due to favorable production conditions and increased acreage.

We are indebted to the offices of the Extension Service, the several Federal and State farm agencies, producers, processors, farmers and others for furnishing pertinent information for the development of this report. To them we express our sincere thanks.

My appreciation and acknowledgement is expressed to Earnie E. Vickrey, Deputy Agricultural Commissioner, and members of our staff for the compilation of this report.

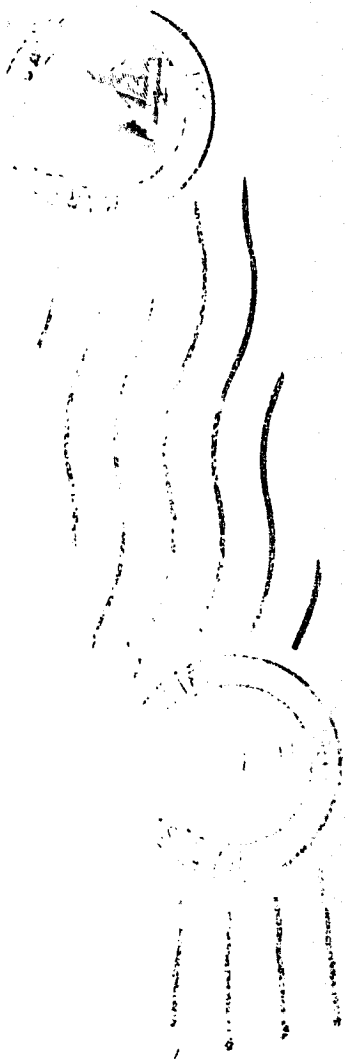

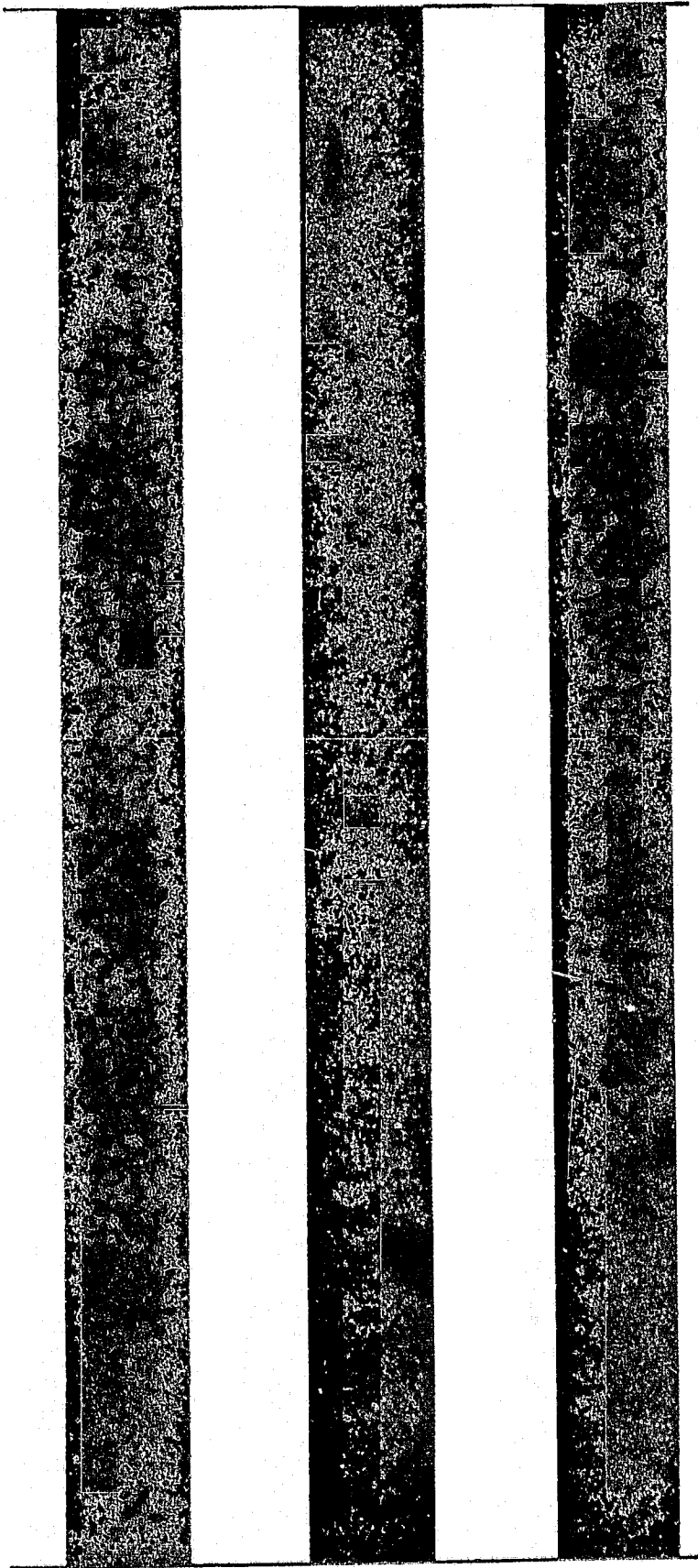

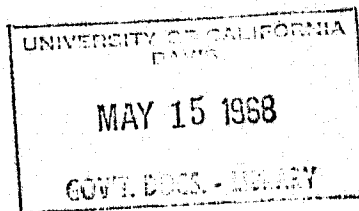

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, we respectfully submit herewith the Yuba County Agricultural Crop Report for the year 1967. Farm commodity values are reported in gross returns and have been determined as near as possible at the point of first delivery.

The total value of Agricultural production for 1967 was \$24,215,100.00. This represents a new high being \$1,621,230.00 greater than that of 1966. Increased production costs however were experienced by producers of all crops and values reported cannot be construed as indicating net proceeds to the farmer.


1967 was a hectic year for producers of most crops with prolonged wet weather in the spring affecting fruit pollination and delaying the planting of field crops including rice. With the exception of pears most fruit and nut crops were substantial but fruit quality suffered.

All in all production made a remarkable recovery from what for a time threatened to be a disastrous year for horticultural crops.

We are indebted to the Federal and State Farm Agencies, the Farm Advisor, processors, farmers and others who have cooperated with us by supplying pertinent information for the development of this report.

This report has been produced by Earnie E. Vickrey, Deputy Agricultural Commissioner. My thanks are expressed to him and members of our staff who aided in it's compilation.

It is my pleasure to present to you the Agricultural Crop Report for the County of Yuba for the calendar year 1970. The report is compiled under requirement of Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code.

The gross value of agricultural production in 1970 was \$29,979,900.00. This exceeds the 1969 total by \$3,874,850.00 and is the highest figure on record in terms of dollar value.


Rising production costs have continued to beset the farming community and it must be stressed that the statistical figures herein contained cannot be construed as reflecting net income.

The greatest increase was noted in the production of fruit and nut crops. This was largely influenced by a heavy prune crop. A substantial increase was noted in livestock and poultry production. This was due particularly to the heavier volume of livestock through local feed yards.

This report has been compiled by Deputy Agricultural Commissioner Earnie E. Vickrey.

Our sincere appreciation is expressed to the State Department of Agriculture, the offices of marketing organizations, the office of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, numerous growers and others who have supplied pertinent information for the compilation of this report.

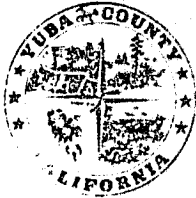



LEADING AGRICULTURAL COMMODITIES SUMMARY

PEACHES Up - \$1,004,604.00 - This increase is due to an increase in bearing acreage combined with high yields, even though prices were off.

RICE Up - \$1,652,500.00 - A slight increase in acreage coupled with higher yields and better prices, contributed to this increase.

CATTLE AND CALVES Up - \$967,281.00 - The total number of livestock marketed was down, however the average price was up.

PRUNES Down - \$1,999,700.00 - The prune crop was a total failure in some areas, due primarily to warm weather and low humidity during bloom, resulting in a short bloom period, with no or very little fruit set.

MILK Up - \$289,000.00 - Production was up considerably. Price received for market milk was down slightly while manufacturing milk prices were up.

PEARS Up - \$108,930.00 - Slight increase in bearing acreage. The yield was down but off set with substantial increase in prices.

WALNUTS Up - \$244,504.00 - Higher prices received by growers.

PASTURE-IRRIGATED Up - \$105,000.00 - More demand for pasture thus increasing grazing value.

ALMONDS Down - \$65,530.00 - Reduction in production that was partially due to cool temperatures during bloom affecting pollination. This was partially off set by bearing acreage increase and higher prices received.
